320th Bombardment Group (M).

BAD MÜNSTER RAILROAD BRIDGE (M/R: (N) N-083351, GSOS 4416, Sheet T-2), Germany.

Alternate Target: EPPELSEIM AMMUNITION DUMP (M/R: (N) N-310243, GSOS 4416, Sheet U-2), Germany.

Last Resort Target: LAHR BARRACKS & SUPPLY AREA (M/R: (N) N-113710, GSOS 4416, Sheet T-2), Germany.

At 11:46 hours, 33 B-26's took off to bomb Bad Münster Railroad Bridge (M/R: (N) N-083351, GSOS 4416, Sheet T-2), Germany. 4 B-26's returned early: 2 spares; 1 engineering; 1 sick crew member. Total sorties: 29. 29 B-26's were over the primary target at 13:53 hours at 11,200', but did not bomb due to 10/10ths cloud cover, and 29 B-26's were over the alternate target at 14:00 hours at 11,200', but did not bomb because alternate could not be picked up in time. 29 B-26's were over the last resort target and 27 B-26's dropped 214 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & non-delay tail fuses) on the last resort target at 15:01 hours from 11,200' to 10,400' on an axis of 70°T. 2 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs, having hung up, were salvoed in the target area, and 8 x 500-lb. Demolition bombs, due to flak damage, were salvoed at R-2496. No bombs were returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. 7 B-26's damaged by flak: Category I, and 1 B-26 damaged by flak: Category II. 28 B-26's returned to base at 15:46 hours. 1 B-26 landed at Luneville, due to engine trouble, en route from primary.

AIR OBSERVATIONS:

a. Activity: 17 P-47's provided good escort, but B-26's reported single P-47's diving close to formation.

b. Situation: None.

FLAK: M, H, A, A, -CP type flak encountered from N-3623 in bursts of 4 and 6 and lasted for 45 seconds.

Losses to flak: None. Damaged by flak: Category I - 7. Category II - 1.

ROUTE: Base to Laneville, 0-0600, rendezvous; to Sarrebourg; to Wingen, 0-7436; to Niederbronn, 0-9339; to Wilgartswiesen, R-1068; to Grunstadt, M-3107; to Alzey, M-2728, IP; to Bad Münster, Primary target; break left to Hochstadtten, M-0730; to alternate target; break right to Grunstadt, M-3107; circled in trying to get through to Eppelsheim; reciprocal course to Sarrebourg; to St. Marie, V-5861; to Wittisheim, V-8863, IP (briefed axis over IP - 69°T; evasive action over IP - loss of altitude; drift correction over IP - 05° right; escorted by 17 P-47's); to last resort target; break right; reciprocal course to base.

WEATHER:

- a. Enroute: 7/10ths stratocumulus, tops 5,000', Dijon to Saverne. Vis. 3 - 4 miles in haze.
- b. Target Vicinity: North of Saverne 8 - 10/10ths stratocumulus, tops estimated 5,000'.
- c. Target Area: At Primary target 10/10ths stratocumulus, with altocstratus overcast at 13,500' extending to North-West and moving into target target area. In Rhine valley, 2/10ths stratocumulus with vis. 10 - 15 miles in light haze. Alternate target was open.
- d. Return: As enroute.

RESULTS: Bombs of 1st Squadron covered the target.  
Bombs of 2 Squadrons landed short.

SPECIAL COMMENTS: 3 A/C preceeded main formation and dropped 16 boxes of "Chaff" from Wittisheim, IP, to Lahr.
