S T A T E M E N T

Lt. Wheeler's Plane was attacked by fighters just after making the turn north of Rome at 1412 hours. Its' tail was partially shot away and one engine caught on fire. The pilot stayed in formation until about 15 miles west of the coast, then headed for Corsica with an escort of 3 B-26's. No radio contact could be made with it by the escort, and escort saw it go down to 2000', fall sharply to 1100', and explode at 1445 hours at 41° 30' N, 11° 05' E. No chutes were seen. An oil slick and one Mae West, partially on fire, was seen.
