## Intelligence Marrative No. 13 Day Operation & May 1943

Seven B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group took off this morning (on the second mission of the day) on a sea sweep to Cavagnana Islands. One B-26 (S) returned early. Two ships were seen; entire formation made a pass at the vesse, but before bombs were dropped, red crosses were sighted on each of the two white boats; no bombs were dropped.

Route: This base to 37° 30' N, 09° 30' E; 37° 15' N, 11° 05' E; Favignana Island; 37° 35' N, 12° 20' E; 36° 25' N, 10° 55' E; Sidi bou Ali; this base.

Chronology: Bombers took off between 10:00 hrs., and 1003:30 hours; rendezvous this base; on course 10:08 hours; no bombs dropped; down this base between 13:08 hours and 13:11 hours.

Bombs: 21 x 300 lb demolition bombs, 4 second delay tail fuse. 21 x 300 lb. bombs returned this base.

Results: No bombs dropped; no suitable target sighted.

Flak: Slight heavy flak encountered from Cape Mamoura at 1200 hours at 3000 ft. altitude. Accurate for altitude, inaccurate in deflection.

Enemy A/C: None.

Observations: Two white ships were observed at 37° 0' N, 11° 38' E from an altitude of 200 ft. at 11:42 hours. Red crosses painted clearly on each of the two white ships indicated that they were hospital ships.

Weather: Low scattered clouds at 1500 ft; slight haze and occasional showers off the coast of Sicily. On the return flight, it was evident that a front was building up off Cape Bon advancing towards Sicily.

Comments: None.
