Intelligence Narrative No. 15 Day Operation 11 May 1943

Thirty-eight B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group took off this morning to bomb Marsala, Sicily. Two planes returned early. Making rendezvous with other medium bombers (B-25's and B-26's) and an escort of P-38's of the 11th Fighter Group at Cape Serrat, they proceeded to target.

Encounters between escorting P-38's and Single Engine E/A before, during, and after bombing run is reported. Four ME-109's attacked one element of our last flight shortly after the bombing run.. We sustained no losses. Two ME-109's were destroyed.

The target was bombed successfully, majority of bombs landing in the southern edge of town.

Thirty-five (35) B-26's down safely at this base by 13:28 hours; the 36th plane landed first at Medjez el Bab for minor adjustments to port engine, later proceeding to this base, landing safely at 15:30 hours.

Route: This base to Cape Serrat for rendezvous, Cape Serrat to a point South of target at 37° 38' N, 12° 20' E; bombing run, breakaway to left; direct to this base.

Chronology: Off between 0930 and 0945 hours; on course 10:00 hours; rendezvous 10:35 hours; bombs away 11:30 hours; down this base (35 planes) between 13:00 and 13:28 hours; last bomber down this base 15:30 hours.

Bombs: 108 x 1000 lb demolitions 1/10 .025 sec delay; 99 x 1000 lb bombs dropped on target; 9 x 1000 lb bombs returned to this base because of mechanical failure in lead plane of one element.

Results: Bombs fell into southern edge of town, with a few sticks landing in water in port area. Huge columns of smoke and some fires reported in target area.

Flak: Light to moderate heavy flak encountered over target area and from points (not pin-pointed) south of Marsala. Flak was accurate for altitude, inaccurate as to deflection and elevation, although toward end of bombing run, data computation had been corrected, and the last flight sustained some damage.

Enemy Aircraft: Encounters between P-38's and 8/4 enemy aircraft were observed by some crews before, during, and after bombing run. Four to five ME-109's attacked the formation directly after bombing run; two 8/4 were shot down, and seen to land in water. Balance of ME's abandoned attack upon approach of P-38's.

Weather: GAVU enroute, over target, and on return.

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Observations: The following three observations were all made at approximately the same time from the same altitude: 11:36 hours from 10,500 feet.

- (a) One B/V heading south at $38^{\circ} 02' N$, $12^{\circ} 22' E$.
- (b) One M/V heading south at $37^{\circ} 55' N$, $12^{\circ} 23' E$.
- (c) One Siebel Ferry heading south at $37^{\circ} 52' N$, $12^{\circ} 24' E$.

One single-engine L/A sighted heading north at $37^{\circ} 55' N$, $12^{\circ} 53' E$, at 11:37 hours at 20,000 feet altitude. Observation altitude 10,000 feet.

Sixteen to eighteen seaplanes in the seaplane base; 11:31 hours, altitude 10,500 ft.

A large ship with a flat white top sighted a few miles west of Stagnana Island at 11:33 hours from 10,000 ft. altitude. Vessel was heading north.
