

Intelligence Narrative No. 25 Day Operation 28 May 1943

Twenty-four B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off this afternoon to bomb Milo A/D, Sicily. They were escorted by 36 P-40's of the 325th Fighter Group. One returned early; a second turned back prior to bombing and landed at Souk el Arba because of mechanical difficulties. Twenty-two B-26's successfully bombed the target; twenty-two landed safely at this base.

Route: 37 degrees True for 274 miles to OP(38° 20' N, 12° 0' E); right turn to IP (10 miles due west of Cape S. Vito); to target; breakaway to the left; continual evasive action; left coast two miles south of Mazara del Val; 250° True for 315 miles to this base.

Chronology: Bombers took off between 1600:30 and 1612. Rendezvous above this field at 1618. On course 1621. Target 1800 hours. Bombers down at this base between 1936 and 2005.

Bombs: 10 x 100 demolition, 1/10, inst., and 3258 x 20-lb. #41 fragmentation were carried.

- 120 x 20-lb. fragmentation bombs were in the plane which landed at Souk el Arba.
- 120 x 20-lb. fragmentation bombs were returned to this base in the B-26 which returned early.
- 2,490 x 20-lb. fragmentation bombs were dropped on the target.
- 528 x 20-lb. fragmentation bombs were returned to this base when they hung up in the bomb racks.

Results: Bomb pattern covered south and west dispersal areas, landing on, or within destructive range of, 32 planes, within damaging range of an additional 10. Bomb trail carried "over," demolishing an eight-coach train and locomotive and damaging buildings in the railroad yards south of the field.

Flak: The formation was under continual fire from intense, heavy flak over Sicily from landfall until they left the coast south of Mazara del Val.

- Intense heavy barrage over Milo A/D.
- Intense accurate heavy from Bo Mizzo and Mazara del Val.
- Intense inaccurate heavy from Castelvetrano.
- Heavy gun emplacements are scattered throughout mountains running north to south, southeast of Milo A/D.
- One heavy battery NE end of runway, Milo A/D.
- Heavy gun emplacements in a clump of trees south and east of Milo A/D

Enemy Aircraft: The P-40's engaged a large force of B/A (ME-109's, MA-200's) from 1758 to 1830. Only six got through to our formation, but were immediately driven off by the escort. (No engagements by B-26's.)

SECRET

The following victories were noted:

- 1 ME-109 crashed into ground 3 miles north of Mile A/D from 11,000.
- 1 ME-109 crashed into ground in vicinity 37° 55' N, 12° 40' E at 1805 from 10,500.
- 1 ME-109, smoking, crashed into water at 1830 off Sicilian coast.

Observations: 3 large M/V and several small M/V in Trapani harbor at 1800, altitude 11,000'.

1 large M/V heading west at 1748 between Favagnana and Sicily from 12,000'.

Our Losses: One B-26 totally destroyed, this base, as a result of a one-wheel landing. Caused by flak damage.

Six B-26's non-operational, flak damage.

Nine B-26's slightly damaged.

Prior to bombing there were the following planes on and around the A/D:

- 61 SE E/A
- 20 TE E/A
- 1 Multi-colored E/A.

In addition there were 26 planes in a damaged condition, or obviously in a state of disrepair.

Comments: The 325th Fighter Group again provided excellent cover.
