## Intelligence Narrative No. 64, Day Operation, 21 August 1943.

Forty B-26's took off this morning to bomb Villa Literno M/Y, Italy. They accompanied the 319th Bombardment Group, and were escorted by 60 P-38's of the 1st Fighter Group. Four B-26's returned early, 1 because of a hydraulic leak, 1 because of faulty gas cap mounting, 1 because the deicer started working, and 1 because of a faulty fun mount. The target was bombed successfully.

Enemy Tactics: Two distinct formations of E/A were seen, each of 25/30 A/C each. The first was sighted before making landfall in vicinity of Ischia Island, the second 25/30 E/A just after bombs away, when both formations attacked. The vast majority of E/A were ME-109's, with some MA-202's, and RE-2001's.

The enemy, used well-planned coordination; while the few MA's hung outside to distract attention, the ME-109's attacked aggressiveks in groups of 10/12, diving from high above our formation to below, pulling up and raking the bellies of our bombers. They concentrated on the second element of the next to last formation, attacking low form 5 o'clock, and both low and high from 7 o'clock.

Their persistent attacks and overwhelming numbers concentrated on this element resulted in a dispersal of our fire; all three planes of that element, and the right wing, first element, of the next flight, were lost.

The ME-109's closed almost to a point of collision. Our gunners

shot down 21 of the attacking aircraft.

Sixteen chutes were counted (2 on fire) from 3 of our destroyed bombers. The fourth bomber to go down successfully crashed landed on the beach in the vicinity of Mondragone.

Routes and Altitudes: To Target: 3h°T for 33 statute miles to Cape Ali Mekk Sidi for rendezvous with escort at 4,000'; 3h°30'T for 30h statute miles to Ventotene Island; 8h°T for 26 statute miles to I.P., Lake Patria, climbing gradually to 11,500'; bomb run, h0°T for 2 statute miles at 10,800'; breakaway left.

From Target: Curve left for 25 miles to coast near Mondragone; 215°T for 366 statute miles direct to this base, dropping gradually to 3,000'.

Bombs: 80 x 500 lb demolition bombs, instantaneous, 45 second delay fuse and 160 x 500 lb demolition bombs, 1/10, 45 second delay fuse, carried by 40 B-26's.

8 x 500 lb instantaneous nose fuse demolition bombs and 16 x 500 lb delay nose fuse demolition bombs carried by the B-26's that returned early.

71 x 500 lb instantaneous nose fuse demolition bombs and 140 x 500 lb delay nose fuse demolition bombs, dropped over the target area.

1 x 500 lb instantaneous nose fuse demolition bombs, and
4 x 500 lb dealy nose fuse demolition bombs returned to this base, habing
hung up over the target.



## Topiale British mist Scores

Chronology: Time off between 10:31 and 10:51; on course, 11:10; rendezvous, 11:20; target 13:03; down at this base between 14:59 and 15:16.

Results: Bombs of one element bracketed the junction of tracks in the southwest position of the target, and those of another element hit across loaded sidings on the curve in the southwestern portion of the target. Bombs of one element fell short. The remainder of the bombs described an excellent pattern across the southern portion of the main yards at the target, with some bubsts carrying over into the town beyond.

Flak: Slight inaccurate heavy flak was encountered from Ischia and Procida Islands on making land fall prior to the bomb run. This flak increased in intensity and accuracy toward the end of the formation.

Enemy Aircraft: (1) Approximately 50/60 E/A, consisting principally of ME-109's with several MA-202's and RE-2001's were seen in two formations of 25/30 A/C each. The first was seen just before crossing the coast prior to the target, and the second on the breaksway after the target. These E/A pressed home aggressive attacks against our formation.

(2) 6 S/P's were seen in Lago di Patri base at 13:00 from 12,000'.

Enemy Aircraft tacties: The tactics were as described in the fore part of this narrative. In addition, the E/A that attacked the last element of the formation attacked threes in line abreast from the rear at our altitude peeling off to the right and to the left, exposing bellies to our rear guns, then diving down.

Observations: (1) In Poxxuoli Bay 6 medium M/V's and 2 large M/V's were seen at 13:00 from 12,000'.

(2) 2/3 small boats moving south along the coast near the mouth of the Volturno River, were observed at 13:13 from 11,500'.

(3) One S/F was seen heading south at 41°08' E, 13° 50° E, at 13:15 from 11,500'.

(4) One T/E transport flying low headed north-northewest along the coast at Castel Volturno was sighted at 13:13 from 11,600'.

Our Lossed: 4 B-26's were shot down on the breakaway from the target. Six other B-26's were damaged by enemy aircraft gun fire. There were no other casualties or serious injuries other than the crews lost over the target.

Victories: 21 ME 109's were destroyed; , MA 202 and 6 ME 109's were probably destroyed; 1 RE 2001 and 3 ME 109's were damaged.

Weather: Enrouse, 1/10 scattered cumulus at 1,000' over the water; target, CAVU with haze; return as enrouse.

Comments: The aircraft of the 319th Bombardment Group, which prededed this group across the target, arrived over the target simultaneously with the escort which had cone slightly ahead to sweep the target area. The planes of the 319th Group broke sharply to the left after crossing the target and the entire escort left the target with them. During our engagement with the enemy fighters the escort was unable to provide protection, but aircraft from the escort returned to engage the E/A as the formation reached the coast.

Correction Intelligence Narrative No. 63, 20 August, 1943 reported that the B-26 which left the formation and went to Sicily on the return from the target, crash landed there. This is incorrect. The B-26 landed safely in Sicily due to engine trouble and returned to this base on 21 August 1943.
