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MEADQUARTERS 320TH BOMBARDHERT CROUF (M) Office of the Group Intelligence Officer AFO 520

Intelligence Marrative No. 70. Day Operation, 6 September 1943.

Thirty-cix B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off this morning to bomb Grazzanise Satallite No. 1 L/G. They accompanied the 17th and 319th Bombardment Groups to the target area and return, and were escorted by P-38's of the 1st and 14th and 82nd Fighter Groups. Five B-26's returned early, 1 because of hydraulic lesk, 1 because of turret gun mal-functioning, 1 because a tail gun jammed, 1 because of low power in the right engine and 1 because a crew member became ill. The target was bombed successfully. An engagement over the target with E/A resulted in the destruction of 2, probable destruction of 3 and damaging of 1 ME 109's. Thirty B-26's returned safely to this base, and 1 B-26 is missing though may have crash landed at Sicily.

Routes and Altitudes: To target: After rendezvous with 17th and 319th
Bomberdments Groups at Djedieda, 40° T for 30 statute miles to rendezvous at
4,000' with the escert at Cape Sidi Ali el Mekki; 37° T for 330 statute miles to
I.P., mouth of the Volturno River, climbing gradually to 10,700'; bomb run,
43° T for 6 statute miles at 10,200'; breaksway left.

From target: Curve left for 15 miles to coast near Mondragene; 215° T for 370 statute miles direct to this base, dropping gradually to 3,000°.

Hombs: 360 x 300 lb demolition bombs, 1/10, 45 second delay fuse, carried by 36 5-26's.

50 x 300 lb desclition bombs returned to this base in H-26's that returned early.

297 x 300 lb demolition bombs dropped over the target area.
3 x 300 lb demolition bombs salvoed after the target, having hung

up over the target.

10 x 300 lb demolition returned to this base, having failed to drop due to rack failure.

Chronelogy: Time off between 10:21 and 10:40; rendezvous with 17th and 319th Groups and on course, 11:00; rendezvous with escert and on course, 11:10; target, 13:02; down at this base between 14:46 and 15:06.

Results: One string of bombs fell along the western edge of the L/G, carrying over 4/5 A/C parked there. Two other strings landed across the center of the L/G in good patterns. A few bombs landed short, but carried into the edge of the L/G.


Flak: Slight heavy inaccurate flak was encountered from Ischia Island, and slight inaccurate to accurate heavy flak was encountered over the target. One or two small barges off shore opposite Lago di Patri fired 3 bursts of inaccurate heavy flak. Three white bursts of heavy flak were fired from Ventotone Island.

Heavy gunppositions were reported as follows:

- (1) I gun at the eastern tip of Ischia Island.
- (2) I gum on the northwestern tip of Ischia Island,

(3) 1 gun Forio en Ischia Island.





Flak (Cont'd):

(4) 2 guns at 41° 13' N, 13° 58' E

(5) 1 battery at 40° 58' N, 14° 31' E. (6) 5 guns on northern edge of Lago di Patri.

After leaving the coast on the return, slight accurate heavy flak was encountered from coastal defense guns. Moderate to intense heavy flak was seen fired at E-25's attacking Capua A/D.

Encay Aircraft: (1) 25/30 NE 109's, MA 200's, MA 202's and FW 190's were seen in the target area at 12:50 from 10,700', which followed the formation for approximately 25 minutes. ME 109's were dark grey with blue bellies, but 1 ME 109 reportedlyhad a black fuselage, a white band around the fuselage back of the cockpit, and a checker-board tail similar to P-40's of the 325th Fighter Group. Another MS 109 reportedly had a white spinner, black engine cowling, dark body and white tail. These attacked the rear flight of our formation.

(2) 2 T/E E/A with twin tails were seen flying west on the deck off the coast near the Volturno River mouth at 12:53 from 10,700'.

Enemy Aircraft Tactica: Attacks by E/A were unagressive generally, but some aggressive attacks were reported.

The attack commenced 15 minutes before the target and continued

10 minutes afterward.

Just before our bombs were drop ed, some a/A attacking the B-25 fermations came in and pressed home.aggressive attacks against our rear flight. Working in cooperation, one E/A made a frontal attack, apparently diversionary, while other ME 109's attacked aggressively from the rear.

Frequent attacks were reported at different flights of the for-

mations by four MR 109's flying line abreast, at six and seven o'clock.

At 13:04, during the breaksway, 7 ME 109's in slight V, at 3,000' range, lobbed cannon shells into the rear of our formation. This fire was fairly accurate. The muzzle fire was a large red flash, and appeared to come from probable 37 mm cannons under each wing of the E/A.

Two E/A attacked from the rear, S - ing alternately, and closing

aggressively.

Single B/A made attacks from high and above, diving below our altitude and attacking the rear flight from below.

15 E/A 2/3000' above our formation, during the bomb run dropped

belly tanks through our formation prior to diving to attack.

One crew reported that while three ME 109's were flying above. shead of, and parallel to the formation, a 500 lb aerial bomb passed within

10 feet of the noss of the plane, and burst in the air below a second or two later. The source of this report is believed reliable.

Snew Shipping: (1) 2 large white liners and 1 medium M/V were seen at Caeta at 13:08 from 9,500', as reported 5 September, 1943. (2) I small boat heading south east leaving Pozzueli

was sighted at 12:59 from 10,400'. (3) 5 small boate heading south one mile south of the Volturno River mouth were observed at 12:59 from 10,400'.

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Enemy Shipping (Cont'd):

(4) One small boat at 41° 10' N, 13° 40' E, heading south at high speed was seen at 13:08 from 9,500'.

Friendly Aircraft: One Twin-engined A/C over Capua A/D sewn spinning toward the clouds below tat 13:02 from 10,000'.

Our losses: 1 B-26 was seen to smoke at engines for a few seconds over the target, (presumable while going into high blower) and simultaneously a radio report was heard stating the hydraulic system was out and bembsy doors would not close. Later this A/C left the formation and headed towards Sicily after stating that he expected to land there. This A/C is missing.

3 B-26's damaged by E/A fire.

Victories: 2 ME 109's destroyed; 3 ME 109's probably destroyed;

Meather: Enroute, 8 to 9/10 alto-cumulous off the coast of Africa at 6,000', scattered cumulous to the target; target, 1 to 2/10 cumulous at 5,000'; return, as enroute.
