Intelligence Narrative No. 71, Day Operation, 7 September 1943.

Forty-one B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group took off this morning to bomb the railroad bridge just south of Sapri, Italy. They were accompanied by the 17th and 319th Bombardment Groups, all of which flew unescorted. Five B-26's returned early. The target was bombed successfully. One B-26 was lost over the target, but all of the crew are believed to have parachuted to safety. Six B-26's left the formation on return from the target and headed toward Sicily. Twenty-nine B-26's returned safely to this base on schedule; 4 B-26's returned late having landed at Sicily for fuel.

Routes and Altitudes: To target, from 3000', 54° T for 220 statute miles to Ustics Island, 150 statute miles to IP, Infreschi Point, climbing gradually to 9500; bomb run 65° T for 13 statute miles (1st 3 flights at 9200 to 9000); 2nd 3 flights at 8700); breaksway right.

From target, curve right to coast; 246° T for 90 statute miles; 234° T for 300 miles to this base, dropping gradually to 3000°.

Bombs: 246 x 500-1b. demolition bombs, 1/10, .025 second delay fuse, carried by 41 B-26's.

 $30 \times 500$ -lb. demolition bombs returned to this base by 5 B-26's that returned early.

6 x 500-lb. demolition bombs salveed in water just prior to bombing by 1 B-26 that was subsequently lost over the target.

210 x 500-1b. demolition bombs dropped over the target area.

Chronology: Time off between 0832 and 0853; rendezvous with 17th and 319th Groups 0910; target 1110; down at this base between 1300 and 1317.

Four B-26's returned at 1527, 1545, 1650, and 1745 respectively. One plane and crew are safe at Castel Vetrano. One B-26 with faulty left prop governor, was left at Termini East. The crew returned to this base in the B-26 which landed at 1745.

Kesults: The first cluster of bombs to land covered south end of the tunnel (south of the target), and the road short of the tunnel on the bomb run.

The second cluster of bombs fell on the south end of the target

scording direct hits on the south end of the bridge.

The last half of the formation completely bracketed the target bridge with bomb bursts.

A few bombs landed over the hills beyond the target.

Flak: Slight to moderate very accurate heavy flak was encountered in the target area.

Slight inaccurate heavy flak was encountered over Lauria on the breakaway from the target.

Heavy gun positions were reported as follows: (Ref: T.C. 3-123-NA):

1) 3 guns at G/7-8.

2) 1 gun at E/16.
 3) 1 gun at 11/19.

4) 1 gun on the knoll south of the target at G-M/21-22.

5) 4 guns forming a square at E-F/26.

6) 1 Battery north of the mouth of the river at L/12.

7) 2 guns (on the breakaway) at 40° 03' N, 15° 42' E,

Enemy Aircraft: None encountered. One unidentified A/C flow parallel to our formation at considerable distance for 8/10 minutes before landfall at Italian coast. Sighted at 1059 from 9800.

2) Two 3-engined transports were seen in the middle of the field,

one S/E A/C in the southeast corner at Prais a Mare, at 1114 from 8700.

Enemy Shipping: 1) 4 MTB's were sighted midway between Scario and Sapri, heading southwest at high speed, at 1108 from 16000.

2) 2 F-boats were anchored in the cove at Sapri at E/16 and

1/14. Sightings at 1110 from 9500.

#### General Observations:

1) Dust and smoke was seen coming from Lauria at 1111 from 9000.

2) Smoke was seen from a point about 4 miles up the Lac River at 1114 from 9000.

3) At 1114 from 9000, letters on the beach spelling "Fraia a Mare,"

surrounded on three sides by concentrations of tents, were seen.

4) 40/50 E/T were observed parked on the road in the vicinity of Rivel-

lo at 1111 from 9000.

5) 30/40 railroad cars were observed in the M/Y at Frais a Mare and approximately 20 between the tunnel and the bridge north of town, at 1111 from 9000.

Cur losses: 1 B-26 salveed bombs in water just prior to the target and turned left as the formation broke to the right. Landing gear was lowered, and 6 parachutes were seen to open. The B-26 then spun to the ground and crashed in flames.

6 B-26's were damaged slightly by flak.

Weather: En route hazy with patches of cumulus at 4000; target CAVU, clouds building up inland from the coast of Italy; return as en route.
