

HEAD BARTERS 320TH BUSHARDSENT CHOUP (E) Office of the Group Intelligence Officer APO 520

Intelligence Marrative No. 81. Day Operation, 18 September, 1943

Twenty-eight 5-26's of the 320th memberdment Group (m) took off this morning to bomb Fratica di Mare L/G. Italy. They accompanied the 17th and 319th Dombardment Groups, and were unescorted. Three n-26's returned early;

1 because teil and turret guns were out and 2 were spares.

The target was bombed successfully. 1 8-26 left the formation after boshing and crash-landed at mateur to give possible medical aid to a pilot flying as Observer who had been hit by flak. The officer died without regaining consciousness, 1 3-26 left the formation and headed toward Sicily after leaving the target, the right engine smoking. It has not yet been heard from. Twenty-three 5-26's returned safely to this base on schedule.

Moutes and Altitudes: To target: From rendevous at 2500' with 17th and 319th Groups at Djedieds, 30°T for 325 statute miles to Falmarola Island; 340°T for 35 statute miles to 1.P., 5 miles went of Angie; climbing gradually to 11,500'. Somb run, 3400T for 17 statute miles at 11,000', breakanay left.

From target: Curve left, 20107 for 366 statute miles to this base, dropping gradually to 3000'.

Boshe: 558 x 100-1b, demolition bombs, 1/10, .025 second delay fuses, carried by 28 B-26's.

60 x 100-1b. demolition bombs returned to this base in 3 B-26's that returned early.

ASS x 100-1b. demolition bombs dropped over the target area. 9 x 100-1b, demolition bombs salvoed, after having hung up over the target, on a wooded area just beyond the target.

1 x 100-1b, demolition bombs returned to this base, having hung up over the terget.

Chronology: Time off between 1142 and 1157; rendezvous and on course, 1210; target 1355; down at this base between 1545 and 1502.

Results: Bombe started at E/8 (TC 3-15-MA) and malked in three strings in an excellent pattern seroes the western portion of the field into the northwestern dispersal area. 9/12 A/C were seen burning on the field among bomb bursts.

- A probable gasoline dump at K/10 was hit, resulting in a sheet of flame 50 yards in diameter, and white smoke reaching 5000' in the air. Mearly the entire field was seen covered with bomb bursts on leaving the target area, as a result of the bombing of the three groups.

Flaks Moderate inaccurate to securate heavy flak was encountered from Anaio to the breaksway from the target, and for five miles out to sea. Over the

target, bursts were seen successively stepping up apparently getting our range. At the same time, several red bursts of flak were seen. Suggested is a possible signal that range had been reached.

Heavy gun positions were som as follows:

1) 3 guns 1 mile inland and 5 miles north of Angio.

2) 4 guns et 1/3-4 (TC 3-15-NA). 3) 1 gun et K/13.

- 1 gum at L/17.
- 5) 2/3 guns at Ansic. 6) 2/3 guns at G/5-6.

7) 3 gums at 41° 43' N, 12° 21' E. 8) 3 gums at 41° 38' N, 12° 35' E.

Enemy Aircraft: 1) one clive-drab colored P-38 was seen flying a course below our formation, of 145°; at 1340 from 11000.

2) On Fratica di Mare 1/G, 10/12 gliders, 30/40 JU-88's and JU-52's were seen at 1355 from 11000.

Enemy Shipping: 1) I small bost was sighted 5 miles off Italian coast heading southwest into Angio at 1357 from 11500.

> In Anxie harbor, 4 medium m/V's, 10 small hoats, were observed at 1348 from 11500.

General Observations: Mone.

Our Losses: One B-26 damaged by flak belly-landed at Mateur, destroying the A/C. One B-26 is missing. Seven B-26's were damaged slightly. A pilot flying as observer was killed by flak.

Weather: No route 5-6/10 scattered cumulus at 5000'; target CAVU, clouds building up inland from the target; return as en route.

Comments: Filots reported having difficulty flying at slow speeds maintained by the leading group.
