Intelligence Marrative No. 89, Day Uperation 5 October 1943.

Twenty-four B-26's of the 320th Bosbardment Group (N) took off this merging to bosh learnis hoad Junction, Italy, They were unsecorted, Two B-26's returned early: I was a spare, and I due to engine malfunctioning. The terget was bombed successfully. Eight B-26's returned safely on schedule and fourteen B-26's returned late after landing at Bo Fisso, Sicily for fuel. Two B-26's, damaged by flak, are in Sicily; the erews are safe and have returned to this buse.

Routes and Altitudes: To target: from 2500 at Djedieda, 300 T for 324 statute miles to Palmarola Island: 30° T for 24 statute miles to Cape San Felice Circes; 50° T for 40 statute miles, to lealasta elimbing gradually to 11500; bomb run 85° T for 31 statute miles at 11000; breaksway left. From target: Curve left for 55 statute miles to

Inoletta: 230° T for 40 statute miles to Cape S. Felige Vireso: 210° T for 368 statute miles to base (16 A/C. 1880 T for 224 miles to No Himse A/D. Sicily).

Boshe: 156 x 500-lb, demolition bonbs, 1/10, 45 second delay fuses, carried by 26 B-26's.

> 12 x 500-lb. demolition bombs returned to base in 2 B-26's that returned early.

143 x 500-1b, demolition bombs dropped over the target area.

1 x 500-lb, demolition bomb returned to this base, having hung up over the target.

Chronology: Time off between 0815 and 0822; on course 0840; target 1043; 8 B-26's down at base between 1253 and 1259; 14 B-26's down at base between 1357 and 1805 after landing at Bo Misso for fuel.

Results: The greater portion of the books landed in a gluster blanketing the read jungtion. One string started short and walked to the end of the visdust on the western edge of the target. The visdust on the south edge of the target was straddled by bomb bursts. A few bombs landed in open ground southwest of the target,

Flak: Moderate to intense heavy accurate flak mas encountered on the heads run and breaks from 41° 33° N, 13° 38° N, following back to lake Impletta on the return. The most intense concentration was over the target itself. Accurate flak fired through cloud cover indicated use of radio fire control.

Heavy gum positions were pin-pointed as follows:

1) 3 gum battery at 41° 33' N, 13° 36' E,

2) 4 gums at 41° 29' N, 13° 47' E.

3) 3 gums at 41° 28' N, 13° 49' E.

Enemy Aircraft: 1) At Aquina A/D, 10/12 A/C, part of them wrecked were on parked around the perimeter. The runnny is apparently uncerviseable. Observation at 1034 from 11000.

2) None encountered.

## (Bons) (Sept Ed.)

Seneral Observations: 1) 40/50 M/T parked on the side of the road headed north just southwest of Isernia, observed at 1039 from 11000.

2) 5 M/T parked on the road just north of Aree were

seen at 1030 from 11000.

3) 8 m/T on road midway between Terragina and Cisterns headed south, observed at 1038 from 11000.

A) Freight train of 25 care traveling north at high speed at Cassino, was seen at 1084 from 11000.

5) 20/25 M/T headed east on road at Acuina A/D were aighted at 1034 from 11000.

Our Losses: None. One B-26 badly damaged, snother damaged, by flak, were left at Bo Risso A/D, Sicily: 10 B-26's slightly damaged by flak,

Weather: In route, towering cumulus, base 2-3000', tops up to 12000, generally 8/10 coverage, occasionally overcast, visibility unlimited; target open, 3/10 towering cumulus 5000° to 10000°, scattered cirrus above 20000°, visibility unlimited; return as en route.

Comments: Nearly five hours were consumed in refueling the 15 B-26's that landed at Bo Risso A/D. Sicily on the return, due to meager facilities.
