Intelligence Marrative No. 105, Day Operation, 1 Dec. 1943.

Flight Commander: Lt. Col Fletcher.

- 1. 320th bombardment Group (4).
- 2. At 1014 hours, twenty-eight (28) 5-26's of the 320th combardment Group (11) took off to bomb Sestri Levante 11/1, Italy. They accompanied the 319th Combardment Group and were escorted by 5-38's of the 1st fighter Group. 4 5-26's returned early: 2 because of high oil temperature and pressure, 2 were spares.

20 b-26's dropped 120 x 500 lb demolition bombs, 1/10, .025 second delay fuses, on the target at 1240 hours from 10,500'; 2 b-26's that were assigned as spares with our formation, filled gaps in the 319th formation and fropped 12 x 500 lb demolition bombs on the 319th target area. 2 b-26's returned 12 x 500 lb demolition bombs to base due to rack failure.

Twenty-three (23) B-26's returned safely to base at 1441 hours, and 1 B-26 returned late after landing the flight commander at Elmes A/D.

- 3. Results: South chockepoint, south end of $\frac{\mu}{Y}$ and industrial plant were hit. Some bombs landed west of the $\frac{\mu}{Y}$. Slue and green flashes were seen among the bomb bursts in the $\frac{\mu}{Y}$.
- 4. Observations:

 a. General: (1) M/Y at the target was free of rolling stock, at 1240 from 11.500.
- (2) 20/30 freight cars were observed in M/Y at viareggio at 1230 from 11,000.

 (3) 6 freight cars were seen in Pisa M/Y at 1224

from 10,000. (4) A gun emplacement was reported at 44. 05. N. 09° 30. E, which was not seen to fire, observed at 1239 from 10,000.

(5) Convoy of 12 M/T was seen a 44° 05' N. 12° 20' E at 1229 from 10,000'.

b. gnemy Air; None encountered. Landing strip was seen on Caprais Island at 1159 from 8,000.

c. Enemy Air Tactics; None.

escort vessels traveling south 2 miles off the coast just north of Marina de Pisa were seen at 1221 from 9,000'.

(2) At Leghorn Harbor, 3 medium M/V's and 5 smaller boats were observed at 1200 from 9,000'.

(3) 4 large M/V with 2 escort vessels were observed headed north 5 miles off Viareggie at 1222 from 10,000'.

(4) At Viareggie, 6/8 drydocks with boats

in each; & small boats in the harbor; observed at 1222 from 10,000.

gnemy shipping (Cont'd): (5) In the harbor at the target 6 small boats, 2 TLC's , 1 tug, one boat apparently flashing signals, were seen at ER | 1943 2449 from 10.500.

(6) In La Spezia Harbor, 3 large M/V

20/25 smaller boats, were seen at 1236 from 10.5001.

(7) 4/5 small to medium M/V were observed

at Campgli harbor at 1240 from 10,000'.

e. Flak: I burst of heavy flak, below the formation, fired from a vessel in the harbor at the target was seen.

f. our Losses: None; no A/C damaged.

- 5. Routes and Altitudes: From rendezvous at 3,000 at base, 11 T for 324 statute miles to coast, 3 miles northwest of Viareggio; 11 T for 22 statute miles to Siltano; 271 T for 17 statute miles to Aulla; 254 T for 17 statute miles to I.P., climbing to 11,000', Levanto; bomb run 308 M for 13 statute miles at 10,500'; breakaway left, 183 T for 340 statute miles to this base, dropping to 3.000' .
- 6. Weather: Enroute, scattered to broken 4/6,000; target, CAVU; return, as enroute.
