## Intelligence Narrative No. 132, Day Operation 17 January 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Col. Flatcher.

- A. 320th Bombardment Group (W).
- B. At 1100 hours 28 B-26's took off to bomb Orte Bh bridge, Italy. They were unescorted. Mone returned early. 28 B-26's were over the target and 28 B-26's dropped 99 x 1000 1b demolition bomb, 1/10 .025 second delay fuses, and 18 x 500 1b demolition bombs (6, 12 and 24 hour delay fuses on the target at 1303 hours from 10,500'. 1 x 1000 1b demolition bomb having hung, was salvoed over the water. 27 B-26's returned safely to this base at 1438 hours, and 1 B-26 returned at 1500 hours.
- C. RESULTS: A good concentration of bombs covered the S approaches of the bridge and several hits were scored on the N portion of the M/Y. The bridge was probably misses.
- D. OBSERVATIONS:

  1. Air: a. Air Activity: (1) 6 S/E A/C were seen at 16,000°, at 4 o'clock headed N at Cape Linaro, at 1250 from 11,000°.

  (2) 4 S/E A/C circling above, at about 20,000°, were seen prior to landfall, at 1242 from 11,000°.

  (3) 1 S/E A/C was seen at 25,000° headed N at the target area at 1303 from 10,500°.

  (4) 1 P-38 was seen weaving at 25,000° at the target area at 1303 from 10,500°.

  (5) 3 unidentified A/C were seen at 20,000° prior to landfall at 1230 from 11,000°.
- b. Situation: 12/15 S/E A/C, a few of which were possibly T/E, were observed dispersed at the S/NW and NE at Furbara A/D, at 1245 from 11,000'. Evidence of L/G construction including 6 large buildings, 4 small buildings, a midway supply dump and several revetments were observed just w of Lake Braciano, at a/point at 1250 from 11,000. Viterbo A/D appeared to be empty at 1252 from 11,000'.
- 2. Ground: General: 6 barracks, symmetrically arranged, were seen at the N side of Lake Vico; and 2 factories, no activity, were seen at the N side of Lake Vico at 1250 from 11,000.

10/12 care seen stationary at Capranic, at 1258 from 11,000'.

10/12 cars, 6 of which were tank cars, were m 11,000'.

3 M/T with trailers, were seen headed SE at 42° 18' N, 12° 08' E, at 1258 from 11,000'.

- Flak: 1. Orte and vicinity at 10,500'.
  - 2. Moderate intensity.
  - 3. heavy.
  - 4. Very accurate for altitude, very accurate for deflection.

- c. Flak: (Cont'd) 5. Continously pointed fire.
  - 6. Two heavy 4 gun batteries at C/10 (TC 3-119-NA). One heavy gun at I/13. One 4 gun battery at 42° 24° N, 12° 25° L.
  - 7. a. 8 to 12. b. Wormal.
  - c. Normal. 8. None.
  - 9. None.
- d. Shipping: None.
- 3. LEESE: 7 B-26's were damaged and 13 B-26's were slightly damaged by flak, 6 crew members were injured, 4 of these slightly.
- 4. WEATHER: 9/10 coverage, base 4,500', tops 7,000', starting at coast of Sardinda and gradually breaking up to NE, becoming clear last part of routs. Light surface haze. Visibility unlimited. Target: Open. 3/10 cumulus, base 5,000' tops 7,000'. Visibility 8/10 miles in ground haze. Meturn: No change.
- E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From this base at 2,500' 41' T for 242 statute miles to 3 miles 5 of Cape Linaro, 30° T for 30 statute miles to Scianonel Cimono, IF, climbing gradually to 11,000'; bomb run 85° # for 10 statute miles to the target at 10,500'; breakaway right; 228° T for 37 statute miles, 221° T for 242 statute miles descending to 2,500' at this base.
