- A. 320Th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 1025 hours, 18 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Orvisto RR Bridge South, Italy. They were unescorted. 1 B-26 returned early because generators were cut. 17 B-26's were over the target, and 17 B-26's dropped 57 x 1000 lb demolition bombs (1/2 1/10, .01 and 1/2 1/10, .025 second delay fuses) and 12 x 500 lb demolition bombs (2 1 hours, 4 6 hours, 3 12 hours and 3 24 hour fuses) on the target at 1226 hours from 10,000'. 3 x 1000 lb demolition bombs were salvoed in the water after the target, having hung up. 2 B-26's were shot down by flak in the target area, and one B-26 is missing due to flak. 14 B-26's returned to base at 1440 hours, one of which crash landed and was destroyed. The crew is safe.
- C. RESULTS: The bomb pattern landed south of the bridge, cutting the tracks at least one point. A damaging near miss was scored on the south end of the bridge by one bomb.

 - C. Flak: 1. Orvieto RR Bridge, South.
 - 2. Moderate.
 - 3. Heavy.
 - 4. Very accurate as to both altitude and deflection.
 - 5. On the bomb run, a single burst of flak, slightly off on deflection but accurate was seen. 8 for altitude seconds later a <u>Fredicted Concentration</u> of flak arrived, which knocked down 2 A/C in the first flight, seriously damaging the other two and knocked down the lead A/C of the third flight. <u>Continously Pointed Fire</u> then followed the formation for a few seconds on the break-away.
 - 6. None Observed.
 - 7. a. 20/25
 - b. Normal
 - c. Normal
 - 8. The single burst referred to in (5) above may have been used for deflection **Gentrol**.
 - 9. None.
 - 3. LOSSES: 2 B-26's lost, I missing due to flak. 1 B-26 crash landed due to flak damage at base and was destroyed; crew is safe. 21 crew members are missing. 6 B-26's were damaged, 5 B-26's were slightly damaged. 8 crew members were injured by flak.

The lead A/C was hit and caught on fire on the bomb run. 6 parachutes were seen to come out and the A/C crashed without exploding at 42° 38' N, 12° 14' E. The fourth A/C in the first flight was apparently hit by flak, peeled off and started down in a steep bank to the left. One main landing wheel was seen to some down, and one parachute was seen to emerge.

- 3. LOSSE Sont'd): No more was seen of a aircraft. The lead B-26 of the third flight was hit on the bomb run, caught on fire, continued on the bomb run until bombs away, peeled off to the left and 6 parachutes were seen to open. This A/C went into a spin, and one chute was seen to emerge just before the A/C crashed and esploded on the top of a mountain just north of Ficulte.
- 4. WEATHER: Overcast, tops 6,000', bas unknown, over water from 30 miles off Corsica to 18 miles off Italy. Visibility good, light surface haze. Target: (Orvieto area). Clear except for stratus in mountain valleys. Visibility good, light ground hase. heturn: Cumulus building up over Sardinia.
- E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at base, 35° T for 246 statute miles to Montalto di Castro; 550 T for 26 statute miles to IF, SE tip of Lake Bolsens, climbing gradually to 11,000'; bomb run 700 M for 14g statute miles at 10,000', breakaway left; 295° T for 20 statute miles to Allerona; 211° T for 42 statute miles to Montalto di Castro; 215º T for 246 statute miles to base, dropping gradually to 2,500'.
