Intelligence Narrative No. 139. Day Operation. 23 Jan 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Brewer.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0825 hours, 33 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the road between Carsoli and Tagliacozzo, Italy. They were unescorted, and nos-26's returned early. No bombs were dropped on the target due to 9/10 cloud cover, although two runs were made at 1025 to 1035 at 12,000'. 12x1000 lb demolition bombs, 1/10, .025 second delay fuses, were salvoed in the water just off Civitavecchia because of low gas supply. 120 x 1000 lb demolition bombs were returned to base. 32 B-26's returned to base at 1243 hours and 1 B-26 returned at 1523 hours, having landed at Naples for fuel.

C. RESULTS: None.

D. OBSERVATIONS:

1. Air: a. Air Activity: 1. Over Avezzano, one S/S unidentified A/C was seen flying to the south of the formation at 10,000' at 1033 from 11,200'.

2. 8 S/S unidentified A/C were observed in the vicinity of Rome flying at 10,000' at 1040 from 12,000'.

3. One unidentified A/c was seen flying south 30 miles SW of Civitavecchia at 1108 hours from 10,000'.

b. Situation: Tarquinia A/D appeared empty to one crew member at 1058 from 11,000'.

2. Ground: a. General: None.

b. Communications: 1. Roads were snow covered in the target area at 1030, seen from 12,000'.

2. 10/15 Mv cars were observed at Carsoli at 1030 from 12,000'.

3. 4 M/T were seen parked on a bridge 4 miles west of Carsoli at 1031 from 12,000'.

4. 2 M/T were seen moving south at Castel di Tora at 1028 from 12,000'.

c. Flak: 1. Civitavecchia, 10,000'. No flak elsewhere.

2. Slight.

3. Heavy.

4. Inaccurate for both altitude and deflection.

5. Barrage.

6. 4 heavy guns at S/6; 6 heavy guns at N-0/18 (TU 3-222-MA).

7. a. Six and four

b. normal

and several small boats

d. Shipping: 1 large M/V at 8-1/4.8 (TC 3-22-NA)/were seen in Civitavecchia harbor at 1058 from 10,000'.

3. Losses: 1 B-26 slightly damaged by flak (1 hole in right wing).

4. Weather: Stratocumulus overcast, base 4,000', tops 6,500' from Sardinia to Italy. Target: 8-9/10 stratocumulus generally same as enroute, with some tops up to 10,000'. Valley stratus observed through breaks. Haze. Visibility good through breaks. Return: no change.

5. ROUTE AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at this base, 61° T for 242 statute miles to Furbara; 84° T for 45 statute miles to IP, 42° 05' N, 13° 00' E, climbing gradually to 12,500'; first bomb run 88° M for 15 statute miles at 12,000', breakaway right; 180° curve; second bomb run, 268° M for 15 statute miles; breakaway right; 265° T for 45 statute miles to coast 1 1/2 miles S. of Civitavecchia; 220° T for 244 statute miles to base, dropping gradually to 2,500'.
