

HEADQUARTERS 320TH BOMBARDMENT GROUP (M) Office of the Group Intelligence Officer APO 520

Intelligence Narrative No. 141, Day Operations, 27 January 1944

Flight Commander: Lt. Aucker.

- A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 0945 hours, 36 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Terni M/Y, Italy. They were unescorted. 2 B-26's returned early; 1 because of an oil leak, and I because of propeller trouble. 34 B-26's were over the target and 34 B-26's dropped 112 x 1000 lb. demolition bombs (1/10 - .025) second delay fuses and 36 x 500 lb. demolition bombs (6-1; 18-12; 12-24 hour delay fuses) on the target at 1152 hours from 11000'. 34 B-26's returned safely to this base at 1335 hours.
- C. Results: An excellent concentration of bombs bracketed the center half of the M/Y and the east choke point. 50/75 cars were seen in the yards and a great number of them were destroyed. One string of bombs landed directly on the Iron Works (Target Chart 3-118+NA).

D. Observations:

1. Air: a. Air Activity: 1 large s/c, unidentified, was seen at 5000', headed southeast off the coast of the Rome area at 1140 hours from 11500'.

b. Situation: It was observed that all A/Ds seen enroute and on return were deserted from 1137 to 1207 from 11500

2. Ground: a. General:

- (1) Considerable activity of men and M/T were seen east of Terni at 1152 from 11000'.
- (2) A RR Bridge was seen under construction at 42°26'N, 12°27'E, at 1147 from 11500'.
- (3) Clouds of smoke and explosions were seen from an area several miles southwest of Rome at 1207 hours from 11000'.
- (4) Evidence of battle activity and large fires were seen several miles south of the Tiber River, 3/8 miles from the coast at 1207 from 11000'.
- (5) Large fires were seen by one crew from Ciampino A/D at 1205 from 11000'. (6) 3 barrage balloons were seen over Lake Braciano at 1202 from 11000.

(7) 8 barrage balloons were seen over home at 1202 from 11000'.

(8) Evidence of gun emplacement construction was observed at 41°55'N, 12°20'E, at 1202 from 11000'.

b. Communications:

(1) 15/20 M/T, armored, were seen moving south just north of Stimigliano at 1202 from 11000'.

(2) 8/12 M/T were seen moving south at Torricella at 1140 from 11000'.

- (3) Considerable M/T activity, some of them with trailers, were seen moving south on both highways east of Lake Brasciano in groups of 2 and 3 at 1200 from 11000'.
- (4) Considerable M/T activity, some with trailers, were seen on the roads just north and south of Lake Brasciano moving southeast at 1200 from 11000'.
- (5) 5 M/T moving west were seen on the road just north of Lake Brasciano at 1145 from 11500'.
- (6) 8 M/T were seen, not moving, 5 miles southeast of Terni at 1152 from 11000'.
- (7) 10/16 tanks were seen about 10 miles west of Rome moving towards Rome at 1202 from 11000'.

(8) 75 M/T were seen by one crew off the road parked in a semi-circle just north of Stimigliano at 1142 from 11500'.

(9) 25/30 KR cars were seen stationary west of Kieti at 1147 from 11500'.

(10) 35/40 MR cars were seen stationary at Fabrica di Roma at 1157 from 11000'.

(11) 15/20 RR cars with 1 engine having steam up was seen stationary at Macarese at 1137 from 11500'.

(12) 20/25 RR cars were seen stationary at Palo at 1137 from 11500'.

- (13) 30/40 RR tank cars were seen stationary at Stimigliano at 1200 from 11000'.
- (14) 60/70 RR cars were seen stationary north of Stimigliane stretched over a 3 mile section at 1202 from 11000'.
- (15) Several strings of RR cars were seen, not moving, between Stimigliane and Torrita Tiberine at 1202 from 11000'.
- (16) 40/50 RR cars plus 1 engine with steam up was seen, not moving, at 42003'H, 12019'E, at 1202 from 11000'.
- (17) 10/15 RR tank cars were seen, not moving, at Ladispoli at 1207 from 11000'.
- (18) 12/15 MR cars were seen on the bend east of Ricti moving east at 1150 from 11000'.
- (19) 4 RE cars were seen stationary at Monte Franco at 1157 from 11000'.
- (1) Target area 11000'.
- (2) Slight.
- (3) Light.
- (4) Inaccurate for altitude and deflection.

(5) Continuously pointed fire.

- (6) 1 gun was observed firing from 11/0 (TC 3-118-NA).
- (7) a. None. b. Normal. c. Normal.
- (8) None.
- (9) None.

d. Shipping:

- (1) 3 medium bardges were seen at the mouth of the Tiber River at 1202 from 11000'.
- (2) 1 large M/V was seen anchored at Fiumicino at 1202 from 11000'.
- (3) 4 small boats, not moving, were seen in the bend of the river north of Rome at 1202 from 11000'.
 - 3. Losses: None.
- 4. Weather: Enroute: A few very widely scattere d stratus at 4000'. Visibility 15/20 miles in light haze.

Target: CAVU. Return: No change.

- E. Routes and Altitude: From this base at 2500', 42° T for 242 statute miles to the coast at Mararase; 34° T for 35 statute miles to Stimigliano; IF, climbing gradually to 11500'; bomb run, 19° M for 20 statute miles to the target at 11000'; breakaway right; 210° T for 20 statute miles; 214° T for 35 statute miles; 225° T for 242 statute miles descending to 2500' at this base.
