Intelligence Narrative No. 115, Day Operation, 6 Feb 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Hunter.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0935 hours, 27 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group took off to bomb Orte M/Y, Italy. 4 B-26's returned early; 1 because of ill gunner, 1 because of an oil leak and 2 were spares. No bombs were dropped on the target; 2 B-26's salvoed 16 x 500 lb demolition bombs (long delay fuses) in the water; all other bombs were returned to base. The formation turned back at 1152 hours at 11,000' over Alfadena because of cloud cover which prevented the formation from reaching the target. Spitfires provided escort from Castel Volturno. 22 B-26's returned to base at 1342 hours and 1 B-26 returned late at 1505 after landing at Naples because of crew member having frozen feet.

C. RESULTS: None.

D. OBSERVATIONS:

1. Air: a. Air Activity: 8/10 Spitfires accompanied the formation from Castel Volturno to Alfadena and back to the coast. No S/A sighted or encountered.  
b. Situation: None.

2. Ground: a. None.

b. None.

c. Flak: Slight heavy, fairly accurate for altitude, very inaccurate for deflection, barrage type flak and slight light flak, inaccurate on both counts was encountered from vicinity of N 0257.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: None.

4. Weather: a. Enroute: One band of towering cumulus, tops 13,000' over water; altostratus and cumulus, tops 13,000' and above over mountains in Italy.  
b. Target: Not reached but appeared overcast.  
c. Return: Towering cumulus had moved closer to Italy.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at base, 67° T for 286 statute miles to Castel Volturno, 4° T to Alfadena, climbing gradually to 11,000'; right curve to Castel Volturno, 247° T for 286 statute miles to base, dropping gradually to 2,500'.
