### HEADQUARTERS 320TH BOMBARDMENT GROUP (M) Office of the Group Intelligence Officer APO 650

## Intelligence Marrative No. 158, Day Operation, 2 March 1944

Flight Commander: Captain Graves.

- A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 1000 hours, 36 B-26's of the 320th Bembardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Gun Assembly at G-012328 to G-022335 to F-992336 to G-005353. They were escorted by aircraft of the XIIth Air Support Command. 7 B-26's returned early, 1 spare, 3 - crew members ill, 2 - engines cutting out and 1 loss of power in engine. 29 B-26's were over the target and 11 B-26's dropped 1,146 x 20 1b. fragmentation bombs on the target at 1202 hours from 11;600'. 108 x 20 lb. fragmentation bombs were salvoed in the target area when they hung up due to rack malfunction. 240 x 20 lb. fragmentation bombs were salveed by 2 early returns due to engine trouble. 2,214 x 20 lb. fragmentation bombs were returned to base because the target was obscured by clouds. 29 B-26's returned safely to this base at 1400 hours.
- C. Results: 7/10 cloud cover in the target area obscured the target and prevented the first Squadron from dropping its bombs. Bombs of the 2nd Squadron fell on the west half of the assigned target area. A fire was observed in this area on the breaksway.

# D. Observations:

### 1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: 5 ME-109's, painted black, were observed at G-0030 at 11,000', headed southwest at 1159 hours from 11,600'. 1 ME-109 broke off. made a pass at the rear plane in the 2nd Squadron, coming in at 5 o'clock, closed to 600 yards, and broke off to the left when the tail gunner fired. This E/A did not fire.
- b. Situation: 4/5 S/E a/c were observed on Cisterna di Roma A/D in revetments at 1204 hours from 11,200'.

### Ground t

- a. General: What appeared to be signal flashes were observed at G-0231, continuing until the formation passed over this point, at 1200 hours from 11,600'.
- b. Communications: 10/15 M/T moving in both directions were observed on the road between Cisterna and Gori at 1205 hours from 11,200'.
- c. Falk: Slight to moderate, heavy, continuously pointed, accurate for altitude, off for deflection, decreasing in accuracy on breakaway, was experienced from time just before the bomb run, through breakaway, and until the coast was reached. Some grey bursts were seen. 3/4 guns were observed firing at G-0320.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: No a/c were lost. 3 B-26's were damaged and 6 B-26's were

slightly damaged by flak.

4. Weather: Enroute: Broken cumulus from 8 to 12,000'. Visibility unlimited. Target: 7/10 cumulus from 4 to 8,000'. Target obscured by clouds. Visibility unlimited. Return: Clear.

- E. Routes and Altitudes: From base at 2,500; 53° T for 242 statute miles to Nettuno, the IP, climbing gradually to 12,500; 42° M for 13 statute miles over the target; breakaway right to coast 142 miles southeast of Nettuno at 11,000; 233° T for 255 statute miles to base, drepping gradually to 2,500.
