Intelligence Narrative No. 171, Day Operation, 22 March 1944.

Flight Commander: Major Malsbury.

- A. 320th Bomberdment Group (M).
- B. At 0735 hours, 27 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Poggibonsi RR Bridges, Italy. 1 B-26 crashed on take-off and was destroyed, 1 crew member was killed and all others were injured. 2 B-26's returned early, 1 because of propeller surge and 1 because of a stuck throttle. 24 B-26's were over the target, and 25 B-26's dropped 157 x 500 lb. demolition bombs (1/10 .025 second delay fuses) and 16 x 500 lb. demolition bombs (6-1 hour; 6-2 hours; 2-6 hour; 2-12 hour delay fuses) on the target at 1023 hours from 8600' to 9400', over an axis of 320. 5 x 500 lb. demolition bombs were salvoed in the target area and 6 x 500 lb. demolition bombs were salvoed in the target area and 6 x 500 lb. demolition bombs were salvoed in the sea, having hung up over the target. 22 B-26's returned at 1207 hours and 2 B-26's returned at 1429 hours after landing at Corsica for fuel.
- C. Results: The target area was covered by a good pattern of bombs. The road bridge was well hit, and a probable hit was scored on the small RR bridge. The large bridge was missed, but both approaches to it were cut. The RR tracks between the bridge and the town were also cut by one direct hit.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: Spitfires from Corsica provided excellent escort.
- b. Situation: 1 S/E a/c was seen in an open field at Q6427 at 1023 hours from 8600'.
 - 2. Ground:
- a. General: A military camp, consisting of long buildings and straight roads was seen at S. Vincenzo at 1239 hours from 8000.
- b. Communications:
 (1) 1 train, 4/5 cars heading north out of Poggibonsi at Q6044, was seen at 1023 hours from 8600'.
- (2) 15/20 RR cars were seen in M/Y at Castelfiorentino, 5551, at 1025 hours from 8500'.
- (3) 10/15 RR cars were seen at Valterra, Q4528, at 1025 hours from 9000
- (4) 8/10 RR cars were observed at Q1914 at 1042 hours from 8000'.
- (5) 38 RR cars (22 of which were coaches) were seen on track northwest of target at 1025 hours from 8600'.
- (6) 20 RR cars were seen in Poggibonsi M/Y at 1023 hours from 8600'.
- (7) 15 M/T were seen on r oad just east of Volterra, Q4528, at 1015 hours from 9000'.
 - c. Flak:
- (1) No flak was encountered at the target.
- (2) From south of S. Vincenzo, slight heavy flak, accurate for altitude very inaccurate for deflection, about 20 bursts were encountered. 1 4 gun position was seen firing at E1789 and another position was seen firing at V2191.

- d. Shipping:
 (1) 8/10 small boats were seen in Porto Ferraio, Elba, D9975, at 1011 hours from 9000.
- (2) 4 long slender boats on the beach just north of Cecina Marina, 91518, were seen at 1143 hours from 8000'.
- (3) 2 small M/V, 4 barges, were seen at Piombino at 1012 from 9000'.
 - 3. Losses: 1 B-26 crashed on take-off and was destroyed.
 4. Weather: Enroute: 3-4/10 cumulus in patches, 4-8000'.
 Target: Open. 2/10 cumulus in patches, 4-7000'.
 Return: Clouds building up.
- E. Routes and Altitudes: From base at 2500'; 13° T for 129 statute miles to C. Ferro; 0° T for 98 statute miles to Borgo; 55° T for 65 statute miles to S. Vincenzo; 50° T for 22 statute miles to IP, Pomarane climbing gradually to 11,000'; bomb run 32° T for 18 statute miles to target; breakaway left; 230° T for 40 statute miles to S. Vincenzo; reciprocal course to base.
 - F. Comments: Crew member killed in crash on take-off as follows: Williams, B. Oran 2nd Lt. 0-681265 Co-Pilot.
