Intelligence Narrative No. 177. Day Operation, 29 March 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0804 hours, 28 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Arezzo RR Bridge, Italy. 4 B-26's, all spares, returned early. 24 B-26's were over the target at 1035 hours at 10,000' but no bombs were dropped due to 10/10 cloud cover over all target areas. All bombs were returned to base by 24 B-26's that returned at 1231 hours.

C. Results: None.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

- (1) Excellent escort was provided by Spitfires from Corsica.  
(2) 1 T/E a/c was seen flying north at 20,000' between Elba and the Italian coast at 1000 hours from 10,000'.  
1 B-17 was flying south over Elba at 1000 hours from 10,000' drawing no flak.

2. Ground:

a. General: 2 active factories were seen at Canneto, area of Q30, at 1040 hours from 10,000'.

b. Communications: 13 M/T were seen near a junction at Montecelio headed south at 1004 hours from 10,000'.

c. Flak: None.

d. Shipping:

- (1) 7 small barge-type vessels in Harbor, one 5,000 ton M/V lying 1/2 mile north of Harbor, at Porto Ferrajo, were seen at 1000 hours from 10,000'.  
(2) 1 small M/V was observed at Populonia at 1000 hours from 10,000'.  
(3) 1 barge drawn up on the beach at Q1805 was seen at 1000 hours from 10,000'.

3. Losses: None; no a/c damaged.

4. Weather: Enroute: Broken over Sardinia and Corsica, clear over water to within 5 miles of Italian coast.

Target: 10/10 cumulus at 6,000 to 8,000'.

Return: As enroute.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From 2500' at base, 21° T for 116 statute miles to Tavolara Island; 353° T for 115 statute miles to Borgo; 85° T for 77 statute miles to mouth of Ombrone River; 42° T for 37 statute miles to Montalcino; 32° T for 22 statute miles to Monte S. Savino; 33° M for 11 statute miles to target at 10,000'; breakaway left; 250° T for 68 statute miles to 5 miles north of S. Vincenzo; 250° T for 65 statute miles to Borgo; reciprocal course to base.
