Intelligence Narrative No 191, Day Operation, 24 April 1944

Flight Commander: Lt. Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0910 hours, 27 B-26's of this Group took off to bomb Incisa RR Bridge, Italy. They were escorted by Spitfires from Corsica. 3 Spares returned early. 24 a/c were over the target and 23 a/c dropped 181 x 500 lb. demolition bombs (.1 - .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 1132 hours from 8,700'. 11 x 500 lb. demolition bombs, having hung were salvoed, 8 in the target area and 3 in the water. No bombs were returned to base. 24 a/c returned at 1337 hours.

C. Results: The main concentration of bombs bracketed the south end of the bridge scoring a possible hit and several near misses and cutting the south approach. Bombs of 1 flight cut the north approach and bombs of 2 flights landed about 500 yards east of the target.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity: None.

b. Situation: Evidence of L/G construction at 43°05'N-11°30'E, 2 parallel runways Northeast-Southwest and a dispersal area among the trees northwest of field was seen at 1150 hours from 8,500'.

2. Ground:

a. General:

(1) A white column of smoke rising to 1,000' was observed at V-7087 at 1120 hours from 9,000'.

(2) Supply dumps at Rapolano RR Station were seen at 1120 hours from 9,000'.

b. Communications:

(1) 40 RR cars at Arezzo M/Y and the craters therest seemed filled, were seen at 1140 hours from 8,500'.

(2) 70 RR cars in 2 strings with engines on north end at R-2128, were seen at 1240 hours from 8,500'.

(3) 70 tank cars in M/Y at Fulciano were seen at 1240 hours from 8,500'.

(4) 40/50 RR cars at Castiglion Fiorentino were seen at 1225 hours from 9,000'.

(5) 20 RR cars at Cortona were seen at 1140 hours from 8,500'.

(6) 35/40 tank cars at Asciano M/Y were seen at 1145 hours from 8,500'.

(7) 30 RR cars at San Casciano were seen at 1120 hours from 9,000'.

(8) 130 RR cars at Incisa M/Y and at a tunnel south of the target 4 cars at the north end and 1 car at the south end were seen at 1132 hours from 8,700'.

(9) 30 RR cars at Castiglioncello were seen at 1120 hours from 9,000'.

(10) 6/8 hospital cars at Subbiano were seen at 1125 hours from 9,000'.

(11) 40 tank cars at Sinalungs were seen at 1125 hours from 9,000'.

(12) 30 RR cars at Monte San Savino were seen at 1125 hours from 9,000'.

(13) 40 RR cars at S. Pietra in Palazzi were seen at 1125 hours from 9,000'.

- (14) 55 RR cars at Castelfiorentino were seen at 1124 hours from 9,000'.
- (15) 25 M/T, 5 miles southeast of Siena, not moving, were seen at 1145 hours from 9,000'.
- (16) 15/20 M/T heading north on road just north of Montieri were seen at 1125 hours from 9,000'.
- (17) 150/200 RR cars at Siena M/Y was reported by 1 crew member at 1145 hours from 85,00'.

c. Flak:

- (1) From Rignano, meager, heavy, accurate for altitude and inaccurate for deflection, CP flak from 1 or 2 batteries in north slopes of hills east of Rignano in bursts of 4.
- (2) From Leghorn, meager, heavy, very inaccurate flak.
- (3) Moderate, heavy barrage flak was observed directed at the 17th Group near Arezzo A/D.

d. Shipping:

- (1) 1 large M/V and 10/12 small boats at Porto Ferraro at 1100 hours from 9,000'.
- (2) 1 large M/V and 2 destroyer like vessels off Leghorn, were seen at 1100 hours from 9,000'.
- (3) 4/5 medium M/V at Piombino were seen at 1100 hours from 9,000'.

3. Losses: None.

4. Weather: Enroute: High overcast over Sardinia, clear rest of route; haze limited visibility to 8/10 miles.

Target: CAVU.

Return: Over Sardinia high overcast with lower stratus forming at 4,000'; visibility 10 miles.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From this base 321° T for 55 statute miles to Mal di Ventre, 4° T for 39 statute miles to Porto Torres, 43° T for 72 statute miles to Porto Vecchio, 14° T for 30 statute miles to east of Ghisonaccia, 3° T for 31 statute miles to Alto, 32° T for 79 statute miles to Castiglioncello, 52° T for 23 statute miles to Palai, 80° T for 21 statute miles to San Casciano, IP, 94° M for 13½ statute miles to Incisa RR Bridge at 8,700'; break slight left then right to south of Arezzo, to San Vincenzo, to base.
