Intelligence Narrative No. 196, Day Operation, 1 May 1944

Flight Commander: Major Brewer.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0840 hours, 27 B-26's of this Group took off to bomb Florence Southwest M/Y. This target was obscured by 10/10 cloud cover and Pontedera RR Bridge was bombed as an alternate target. 3 spares returned early. 24 B-26's were over the target and 24 B-26's dropped 192 x 500 lb. demolition bombs (1/10 - .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 1100 hours from 9500' to 8700' on an axis of 360° M. 23 B-26's returned late at 1236 hours and 1 B-26 returned late at 1312 hours after landing at Ghisonaccia, Corsica for gas.

C. Results: The target area was covered with an excellent pattern by 98 bombs, scoring probable direct hits on the bridge. 32 bombs cut the RR tracks 1000 yards east of the target. 64 bombs landed wide of the target area.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

- (1) Spitfires from Corsica provided escort.
- (2) 3/4 S/E unidentified a/c at 25,000' shadowed formation from Florence to coast between 1058 hours and 1118 hours.
- (3) 1 unidentified T/E a/c headed north 5 miles west of Pontedera was seen at 1100 hours from 9500'.

b. Situation: 1 silver colored T/E a/c at 9E (TC 3-45A-NA) were seen at Pontedera A/D at 1100 hours from 9500'.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) 1 supply dump at Q1723 was seen at 1043 hours from 10,000'.
- (2) 1 supply dump at Q5236 was seen at 1052 hours from 10,000'.
- (3) At Q5937, a supply depot was seen at 1054 hours from 10,000'.

b. Communications:

- (1) At P-7/8 (TC 3-45A-NA) a train of 10/12 cars, moving toward the target, was seen at 1100 hours from 9500'.
- (2) At 0/8 (TC 3-45A-NA) 40 RR cars were seen at 1100 hours from 9500'.
- (3) At P-9/10 (TC 3-45A-NA) 40 RR cars were seen at 1100 hours from 9500'.
- (4) 50 RR cars at Q3357 were seen at 1149 hours from 10,000'.
- (5) 16 RR cars at San Romano, Q3961, were seen at 1150 hours from 10,000'.
- (6) 6/8 RR cars at San Pietro were seen at 1118 hours from 8,000'.
- (7) 15/20 RR cars at Castelfiorentino were seen at 1103 hours from 8,000'.
- (8) 8 RR cars on the bridge at target were seen at 1100 hours from 8,000'.
- (9) 40/50 RR cars at Certaldo were seen at 1158 hours from 10,000'.
- (10) 10/15 RR cars at Greve were seen at 1103 hours from 8,000'.
- (11) 20 RR cars at Q1914 were seen at 1118 hours from 8,000'.
- (12) 15 M/T in convoy headed south at Q5837 were seen at 1103 from 8000'.
- (13) 6 M/T north of S. Casciano, Q5837, headed west, were seen at 1159 hours from 10,000'.

- C. Flak: None.
- d. Shipping: 10/12 small boats at Porto Ferrai, Elba.
3. Losses: None.
4. Weather: Enroute: Scattered cumulus over land; clear over water.
- Target: Primary, 10/10 at 6000'; Pontedera open; visibility 10 - 12 miles; light haze.
- Return: As enroute.
- E. Routes and Altitudes: From 2500' at base, 12° T for 56 statute miles to Gavoi; 30° T for 60 statute miles to Tavolara Island; 353° T for 106 statute miles to rendezvous with escort at Alto; 37° T for 78 statute miles to landfall at San Pietro; to Volterra; to Castellina Marittima, climbing gradually to 10,000'; bomb run, 360° M to target; breakaway right to San Pietro; reciprocal course to base.
- F. Comments: 24,000 "nickels" were dropped in the target area.
