Intelligence Narrative No. 198. Day Operation. 2 May 1944.

Flight Commander: Major Macia.

- A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 1245 hours, 26 B-26's of this Group took off to bomb Florence Southwest M/Y, Italy. 3 B-26's returned early: 1 with engine cutting out (entitled to sortic credit) and 2 spares. 23 B-26's were over the target and 22 dropped 176 x 500 lb. demolition bombs (1/10 - .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 1501 hours from 9700' to 9100' on an axis of 35° T. 8 x 500 lb. demolition bombs were returned, having hung up over the target. 23 B-26's returned at 1645 hours.
- C. Results: The target area was covered by an excellent pattern of bombs, destroying 150 of approximately 300 cars and wiping out the greater part of the factory area. 7 huge fires in the factory area and 2 in the RR yards were burning 40 minutes after the bombing.

Observations:

Air Activity: Spitfires from Corsica provided escort.
Situation: 1 T/E s/c at Florence/Peretola A/D on southwest corner near the hanger was seen at 1501 hours from 9700'.

2. Ground:

General:

(1) Ammunition dump at 23612 consisting of boxes piled in a spokeshape and with tracks among them was seen at 1458 hours from 10.500'. (2) At 1605 hours from 9,000', a parachute was seen in the water at 42053'N-10'04'E.

(3) At 1600 hours an oil slick was seen at 43010'N-10010'E.

b. Communications:

Certaldo RR Bridge had been repaired by 1457 hours, seen from 11000'. (1) (2) 75/100 RR cars at impoli, 25563, were seen at 1503 hours from 9000'.

(3) 40/50 RR cars at Signa, and 200/500 others scattered between Signa and Florence were seen at 1503 hours from 9000.

(4) 30 RR cars at Castelfiorentino were seen at 1459 hours from 10000'.

100 RR cars at 46368 were seen at 1458 hours from 11,000'. (5)

200/300 RR cars scattered between Prato and Florence were seen at (6) 1502 hours from 9,000'.

(7) 25 RK cars and 8 hospital cars at 21424, San Pietro, were seen at

1442 hours from 10,000'. (8) 35/40 RR cars, 1 locomotive at Rosignano, 21630, were seen at 1443 hours from 10.000'.

(9) 20/30 RR cars at 21914 were seen at 1445 hours from 10,000'.

(10) 30/40 RR cars at Poggibonsi were seen at 1450 hours from 11,000'. (11) 35/40 RR cars at Certaldo were seen at 1457 hours from 11,000'.

8/9 M/T headed north, north of Volterra were seen at 1449hours from 11,000'.

C. Flak: From Q6879, scant heavy flak, accurate for altitude, inaccurate for deflection, was encountered on the breakaway. A 3-gun positions as observed firing from this location. Another position was firing at G-10 (TC 4-133-NA).

d. Shipping: 1 barge at Casteglioncello was seen at 1441 hours from 10,000.

3. Losses: None.

4. Weather: Enroute: Few scattered cumulus at 5,000'; hazy. Target: Clear: visibility 6-8 miles in haze. Return: As enroute.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From 2500° at base, 12° T for 56 statute miles to Gavoi; 30° T for 60 statute miles to Tavolara Island; 353° T for 106 statute miles to rendezvous with escort at Alto; 37° f for 78 statute miles to Cecine, climbing gradually to 10,000; 80° T for 21 statute miles to Volterra; 42° T for 14 statute miles to Certaldo, climbing to 11,000; bomb run, 33° M for 18 statute miles to target; breakaway left; 217° T for 78 statute miles to Cecina; reciprocal course to base.
