Intelligence Narrative No. 207, Day Operation, 14 May 1944

Flight Commander: Lt. Col. Macia.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 10:15 hours, 28 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Tabienello RR Bridge and RR Bridge South of Poggibonsi, Italy. 4 spares returned early. One Flight of the second Squadron was not in position to drop on its Primary target, and bombed Calafuria RR Bridge, Italy, the alternate. 12 B-26's were over Tabienello RR Bridge, Italy, and 11 B-26's dropped 88 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target, at 12:31 hours from 9,400' to 9,300' on an axis of 76°T. 12 B-26's were over the RR Bridge South of Poggibonsi, Italy, and 8 dropped 64 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 12:35 hours from 8,900' to 9,300' on an axis of 135°T. 4 B-26's were over Calafuria RR Bridge, Italy, and dropped 32 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target, at 12:48 hours from 8,900' on an axis of 50°T. 22 B-26's returned at 14:15 hours and 2 B-26's returned late at 15:17 hours and 15:37 hours, after landing at Corsica for gas.

C. Results: On Tabienello, the bombs were dropped on the second run over the target. An excellent concentration of bombs covered the target, scoring probable direct hits.

On the RR Bridge South of Poggibonsi, the bombs landed in a good pattern just Northeast of the Bridge, missing it.

On Calafuria RR Bridge, the bombs landed 760 yards South of the Bridge on the coast line.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

Spitfires, from Corsica, provided escort.

b. Situation:

1 a/c between the two hangers, North, were seen on Siena/Malignano A/D at 12:35 hours from 8,900'.

2. Ground:

a. General: None.

b. Communications:

(1) 2 locomotives and 60/65 RR cars in Siena RR Yards were seen at 12:35 hours from 8,900'.

(2) 50/60 RR cars at Q-1424 were seen at 12:07 hours from 9,000'.

(3) 100 RR cars at Q-3614 were seen at 12:35 hours from 8,900'.

(4) 20 RR cars in Castelfiorentino, Q-5550, were seen at 12:30 hours from 9,000'.

(5) 50/75 RR cars at Q-1630 were seen at 12:07 from 9,000'.

(6) 20/30 RR cars at Q-2003 were seen at 12:10 hours from 9,000'.

- (7) 35/40 RR cars at Q-7326 were seen at 12:31 hours from 9,000'.
- (8) 8/9 M/T among factories at Q-4807 were seen at 12:10 hours from 9,000'.

(9) 2 M/T headed South, and scattered M/T moving South in the vicinity Southeast of Cecina were seen at 12:07 hours from 9,000'.

(10) 50 M/T parked at Q-1915 were seen at 12:05 hours from 9,000'.

c. Flak: From Leghorn over Calafuria, scant heavy accurate for altitude, inaccurate for deflection, continuously pointed fire, was encountered. None from Primary targets or elsewhere.

d. Shipping:

(1) 1 small barge at Q-1719 3/400 yards up river, was seen at 12:07 hours from 9,000'.

(2) 3 small boats in cove at Calafuria target were seen at 12:48 hours from 9,000'.

(3) 1 small M/V in Porto Ferrajo, Elba, was seen at 13:05 hours from 8,000'.

(4) 1 Med. M/V off Cecina was seen at 12:07 hours from 9,000'.

3. Lenses: None; Damaged: by flak, 2.

4. Weather:

a. Enroute: Generally clear, visibility 10/15 miles in haze.

b. Targets: Clear.

c. Return: As enroute.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From base at 2,500' to rendezvous at Alto; to Cecina; to Pomerance, climbing to 10,000'; to targets at 9,000'; breakaway right; to Pomerance; to targets; breakaway right; to Pomerance; to Cecina (one flight circled at sea, ran on Calafuria; breakaway right); reciprocal course to base.
