Intelligence Narrative No. 219, Day Operation, 26 May 1944

Flight Commander: Major Brewer.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 07:20 hours, 50 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Viterbo Road Defiles North and South, Italy. 2 returned early: 1 engine temperature excessive; 1 propeller governor out. 48 B-26's were over the targets. 4 B-26's dropped 13 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses), 1 x 1,000# Demolition bomb (6 hour delay fuse), and 1 x 1,000# Demolition bomb (12 hour delay fuse) at 09:36 hours from 10,600' on an axis of 340°T, on the road junction at the Southwest corner of Viterbo because the target was not identified; the junction was covered with an excellent pattern of bombs. 4 B-26's dropped 14 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses), 1 x 1,000# Demolition bomb (6 hour delay fuse) and 1 x 1,000# Demolition bomb (12 hour delay fuse) at 09:36 hours from 9,600' on an axis of 340°T on a Railroad Bridge 600 yards Southeast of the South target, mistaking it for the South target. These bombs landed slightly short, cutting the Railroad tracks. 12 B-26's dropped 42 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses), 3 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (6 hour delay fuses) and 3 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (12 hour delay fuses) at 09:36 hours from 10,000' on an axis of 240°T 2,000 yards Southeast of the town of Viterbo because of bombsight malfunction on the bomb run in the lead a/c of that Squadron. These bombs cut the highway at that point. 3 B-26's dropped 11 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) and 1 x 1,000# Demolition bomb (6 hour delay fuse) on the highway junction 5 miles South of Montalto di Castro, A-0417, at 09:50 hours from 9,200' on an axis of 285°T. These bombs covered the junction. 24 B-26's dropped 82 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses), 6 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (6 hour delay fuses) and 6 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (12 hour delay fuses) on the North target at 09:36 hours from 11,600' to 12,500' on an axis of 240°T. The target was covered with an excellent concentration of bombs scoring many direct hits and blocking the roads. 4 x 1,000# Demolition bombs were salvaged in the target area because bombing switch was knocked out by flak. 1 x 1,000# Demolition bomb was salvaged in the water, having hung up over the target. 2 x 1,000# Demolition bombs were returned to base, having also hung up. 46 B-26's returned to base at 11:05 hours and 1 B-26 returned to base late at 12:41 hours after landing in Corsica for gas. 1 B-26 is non-operational at Corsica, reason unknown.

- (7) 1 train of 15 cars headed North at A-0218 at 09:50 hours from 9,000'.
- (8) 1 train of 20 RR cars headed North at A-0614 at 09:50 hours from 9,000'.
- (9) 15 RR cars at A-0812.
- (10) 2 convoys, each 35 M/Ts' facing South, standing, at F-5882 at 09:30 hours from 11,000'.
- (11) 8 M/T headed North at F-5308 at 09:30 hours from 11,000'.
- (12) 20 M/T parked facing North at A-4412 at 09:32 hours from 10,500'.
- (13) 8 M/T moving South at A-4116 at 09:31 hours from 10,000'.
- (14) 25 M/T parked facing West at A-6023 at 09:32 hours from 10,000'.
- (15) 25 M/T standing at A-5223 at 09:33 hours from 10,000'.
- (16) 30 M/T moving North at A-4233 at 09:32 hours from 10,500'.

c. Flak: From Viterbo, heavy moderate, accurate for altitude, inaccurate for deflection, barrage at first, continuously pointed fire on breakaway, was encountered.

1 - 4 heavy gun battery at K-21 (TC 3-233-NA).

1 - 4 heavy gun battery at H-15 (TC 3-233-NA).

From Tuscanis, 20 heavy bursts inaccurate for both altitude and deflection, were encountered.

d. Shipping: 2 small PT boats 5 miles off shore headed South at F-4072.

3. Losses: None; damaged by flak, 3: Nos. 5, 7, and 8, 1st Squadron.

4. Weather:

a. Enroute: Few scattered clouds at 6,000'; haze.

b. Target: CAVU.

c. Return: As enroute.

D. Routes and Altitudes: From base at 2,500' to rendezvous with escort at Borgo; to landfall at Palo; to Southeast corner of Lake Bracciano, climbing to 11,000'; to target at 10,000'; breakaway left to coast South of Montalto di Castro; reciprocal course to base.
