Intelligence Narrative No. 231, Day Operation, 3 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Major Brewer.

A. At 0935 hours, 30 B-26's took off to bomb Bucine N. Viaduct, Italy. (M/R R-059375, Sheet 1114). 3 B-26's returned early: 2 spares; 1 propeller governor out, 27 B-26's were over the target and 27 dropped 105 x 1000 lb demolition bombs (instantaneous and .01 fuses) on the target at 1202 hours from 10,500' to 8,500' on an axis of 220° T. 1 x 1000 lb demolition bomb was salvaged in the water on return, having hung up; 2 x 1000 lb demolition bombs were returned to base. 27 B-26's returned to base at 1402 hours.

C. RESULTST: The target was covered with an excellent pattern of bombs. At least two direct hits were scored in the center of the bridge and the SE approach was cratered. Photos reveal that attack by this group of 2 June 1944, collapsed one span, holed two others and cratered NW approaches.

D. OBSERVATIONS:

1. Air:

a. Activity: Spitfires rendezvoused at target and escorted formation to Corsica.

- b. Situation: 1. 8 S/E and T/E A/C at Siena S A/D, on S<sub>2</sub> end.  
2. 5 S/S A/C at Arezzo A/D  
3. 9 S/E A/C on Pian del Lago.

2. Ground:

a. General: At Q1815, supply dump.

b. Communications:

1. 90 RR cars between Q8318 to R1307.  
2. 1 train of 25 cars moving south at R0507 at 1152 hours.  
3. 1 locomotive standing at R3118.  
4. 150/200 RR cars between R0340 to R3118, including one train of 35 facing south, and including 11 strings of 5/8 cars each just north of the target compared with 7 strings in same place seen on 2 June 1944; at 1203 hours.  
5. 40 RR cars at R5044.  
6. 20 M/T facing east at Q4527 at 1218 hours.  
7. Considerable scattered M/T movement, mostly south, in area of route over enemy territory.

c. Flak: None.

d. Shipping: 3 small boats off Castiglioncello at 1141 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather: Enroute: Generally clear with few bands of cumulus at 5,000'.  
Target: Clear with few scattered clouds at 6,000'.  
Return: As enroute.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at base, to Alto; to Cecina; to Castig-  
~~ione~~ Fiorentino; to Rieve S. Stefano; to IP, Cassina, climbing to 11,500'; to target  
to 10,500'; breakway slight left; curve right; to Cecina; reciprocal course to base.
