Intelligence Narrative No. 232, Day Operation, 4 June 1944.
(Mission #1)

Flight Commander: Col. Macia.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 15:18 hours, 20 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Castiglione Fiorentino Railroad Bridge (Q-315183, Sheet 114), Italy. 2 B-26's returned early because they were spares. 18 B-26's were over the target and 17 dropped 136 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 17:30 hours from 6,900' to 8,550 on an Axis of 77°T. 8 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) were returned to base, having hung up over the target. 18 B-26's returned at 19:08 hours.

C. Results: Most of the bombs landed over to the East of the target; some bombs cut the North approaches, but the bridge was missed.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: Spitfires from Corsica provided escort.
- b. Situation:
 - (1) 4 S/E a/c dispersed on South side of Rosia.
 - (2) Grosseto A/D empty.
 - (3) Siena North A/D empty; Siena South A/D 2 S/E a/c wrecked.
 - (4) 2 S/E a/c damaged at Arezzo A/D.

2. Ground:

- a. General:
 - (1) Dump of boxes at V-6398.
 - (2) Supply dump at V-6384.
- b. Communications:
 - (1) 120 RR cars at A-0217.
 - (2) 75 RR cars at B-4987.
 - (3) 160 RR cars between Arezzo and R-7621.
 - (4) 150 RR cars between Siena and R-0507.
 - (5) 2 locomotives in Siena M/Y at 17:20 hours.
 - (6) 20 RR cars at R-1625.
 - (7) 15 M/T moving South at Q-8909 at 17:20 hours.
- c. Flak: None.
- d. Shipping:
 - (1) 3 barges at mouth of Ombrone River.
 - (2) 2/3 small boats 2 miles up Ombrone River.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather:

a. Enroute: Last part, scattered clouds at 7,000'.

b. Italy: Thunderhead and rain inland from mouth of Ombrone River; 10/10ths cumulus at 7,000'.

- c. Target: Open.
- d. Return: As Enroute.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From 2,500' at base to rendezvous with escort at Montecristo Island; to mouth of Ombrone River; to North of Siena; to target; breakaway left to North of Siena; to south of Ombrone River; reciprocal course to base.

F. Comments: None.
