Intelligence Narrative No. 233, Day Operation, 4 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Saylor.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (A).

b. At 1540 hours, 21 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group took off to bomb Staz di Ficulle RR Bridge, Italy (M/N A399756, sheet 130). 3 spares returned early. The formation turned back at Montalto di Castro because of complete overcast at the target. 8 x 500 lb demolition bombs were salvoed in the water by A/C on single engine. 136 x 500 lb demolition bombs were returned to base. 14 B-26's returned to base at 1848 hours and 3 B-26's returned to base late at 1918 hours after escorting another A/C to Corsica. 1 B-26 landed in Corsica on single engine.

- a. Air Activity: Spitfires provided escort in the target area.
- b. Situation: 2 damaged S/E A/C on Tarquinia A/D.

2. Montalto di Castro RR bridge was being repaired.

3. Losses: None. Damaged; None.

4. Weather: a. Enroute: Scattered cumulus at 7,000'.

- b. Target: Solid overcast from 5 miles inland extending over the target.
- c. Return: As enroute.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: Base to rendezvous at Montecristo Island; to Montalto di Castro; to Tarquinia; to base.
