Intelligence Narrative No. 235. Day Operation, 5 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Saylor.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0939 hours, 20 B-26's of the 320th Bomb Group took off to bomb road bridge south of Reiti (M/R B061213, sheet 138, GSME 4164). 2 spares returned early. 18 B-26's were over the target and dropped 72 x 1000 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .01 second delay fuses on the target at 1036 hours from 9,000' to 9,500' on an axis of 105° T, 16 B-26's returned at 1225 hours. 1 B-26 crash landed on the beach SW of Rome. 1 B-26 returned later after escorting damaged a/c circling it and landing for fuel at Naples.

C. RESULTS: Most of the bombs landed over to the east and northwest of the bridge with one or two near misses on the north end of the bridge.

D. OBSERVATIONS:

- 9. 30 RR cars in 2 trains at A8508 and A8704.
- 10. 40 M/T moving N. at A4020.
- 11. 50 M/T, stationary at A4610.
- 12. 50 M/T moving N. at A5309.
- 13. 30 M/T moving N. at A5206.
- 14. 50 M/T moving N. at F4988.
- 15. 40 M/T moving N. at F3286.
- 16. 90 M/T moving SE at F5796.
- 17. 100/200 M/T moving N at A6000 to F6524.
- 18. 50 M/T moving N at A5322.
- 19. 50 M/T, stationary, at A7306.

E. Flak: On the bomb runs and from the town of Reiti to breakaway, moderate heavy accurate fire both altitude and deflection continuously pointed fire and barrage type over town was encountered.

positions: 4/6 heavy guns at 14/4-k (TC 3-63-NA)

2 heavy guns between town and A/D.

d. Shipping: 4 large M/V in Civitavecchia Harbor.

3. Losses: 1 crash landed on beach SW of Rome; crew believed safe. Damaged 15; injured, 8.

4. Weather: a. Enroute: Few scattered cumulus at 5,000'.

b. Target: Clear; 4/10 cumulus at 8,000' on mountains E of target.

c. Return: As enroute.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at base, to landfall at Tarquinia; to Lake Vico; to IP, 42° 25' N, 12° 36' E; to target; breakaway right to Tarquinia; to base.
