Intelligence Narrative No. 236. Day Operation, 5 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Colonel Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0842, 20 B-26's took off to bomb road bridge S.E. of Reiti, Italy (M/R M109197, sheet 138). 2 spares returned early. 18 B-26's were over the target and 9 B-26's dropped 72 x 500 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 1043 hours from 9,600' to 9,000' on an axis of 150° T. 24 x 500 lb demolition bombs were salvoed in water, 8 x 500 lb demolition bombs were salvoed over land and 40 x 500 lb demolition bombs were returned to base. 17 B-26's returned to base at 1235 hours and 1 B-26 returned at 1502 hours after landing an injured crew member at Elmas.

C. RESULTS: The first squadron was badly damaged by flak before bombs away; lead A/C did not drop because of injured bombardier, and other A/C were not in position to drop. The target was covered with an excellent pattern of bombs scoring several probable direct hits.

D. OBSERVATIONS:

c. Flak: From Reiti and on breakaway, moderate heavy accurate for both altitude and deflection, continuously pointed fire was encountered. For positions see first report.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at base to landfall at Tarquinia; to Lake Vico; to Terni; to target; breakaway left to Tarquinia; to base.
