Intelligence Narrative No. 239, Bay Operation, 7 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Shuh.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 1345 hours, 14 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group took off to bomb the Rd. Bridge at E733386, sheet 135. 2 spares returned early. 12 B-26's were over the target and dropped 84 x 500 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .01 second delay fuses), 6 x 500 lb demolition bombs (12 hour delay fuses), and 6 x 500 lb demolition bombs (6 hour delay fuses) on the target at 1524 hours from 11,000' to 10,500' on an axis of 115° T. 12 B-26's returned to base at 1646 hours.

C. RESULTS: The target was covered with a good pattern of bombs, scoring two probable direct hits and cratering approaches. The bridge had already been destroyed prior to bombing.

D. OBSERVATIONS: 1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: Spitfires were seen in target area.
- b. Situation: No A/C on Grosseto A/D.

2. Ground:

- a. General: None.
- b. Communications: 250 RR cars between E6560 and E7331.
- c. Flak: None.
- d. Shipping: 1. 2 barges at E5333.
2. 2 small fishing boats at Porto San Stefano.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather: a. Enroute: GAVU.

- b. Target: Open; solid overcast 15 miles inland, tops 7,000'.
- c. Return: As enroute.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at base, to Montecristo Island; to IP, Formiche di Grosseto Island at 12,000'; to landfall 5 miles south of Talamone; to target at 11,000'; slight break left; breakaway right to east of Lake Orbetello; to base.
