Intelligence Narrative No. 243, Day Operation, 9 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. at 08:30 hours, 20 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Road Bridge at V-673924, North of Roccastrada, Italy. 2 spares returned early. 18 B-26's were over the target and dropped 142 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 delay fuses) on the target at 10:21 hours from 9,500' to 9,000' on an Axis of 135°T. 2 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 delay fuses) were returned to base having hung up over the target. 18 B-26's returned to base at 11:50 hours.

C. Results: Bombs of first Squadron landed on the South end of the bridge, scoring possible hits. Bombs of the second Squadron landed squarely on the bridge causing a tremendous explosion, believed to be detonations planted by the fleeing enemy. The Flight Commander reported seeing the mountain top, just West of the bridge, moved almost intact over the bridge.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: 2 P-47's were seen bombing in the target area.
- b. Situation: Grosseto A/D empty.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) Bivouac area at V-2498.
- (2) Grosseto Road Bridge out.

b. Communications:

- (1) 90 RR cars at G-2003 to B-6267 and at B-5583, one train of 20 cars facing North, stationary.
- (2) 20 RR cars at V-4790.
- (3) 30 M/T, stationary, facing North at V-5898 at 10:18 hours.

c. Flak: None.

d. Shipping:

- (1) 4 barges at B-1493 at 10:15 hours.
- (2) 5 barges at B-5353 at 10:07 hours.
- (3) 1 large, 2 small boats at B-6443 at 10:06 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather: CAVU in all areas.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From 2,500' at base to landfall at I.P., Castaghetto Carducci, at 10,500'; to target at 9,500'; sharp right break to North of Tatti; to coast East of C. Sparviero; to base.

F. Comments: Correction Narrative No. 242:

A/C reported in Corsica was destroyed in crash landing at Bastia, resulting from heavy flak damage. Crew safe; pilot injured by flak. This makes 1 lost to flak and 9 instead of 10 damaged. No change on number of injured men.

This A/C was attacked by 2 Me-109's at coast south of Cecina. from near and low. Each made only one pass, closing to 600 yards and firing cannon. No hits and no claims.
