Intelligence Narrative No. 245, Night Operation, 8 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 00:07 hours, 10 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Perugia, Italy. 1 spare returned early. 3 B-26's lost the formation and dropped 22 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on Port Ercole, target of opportunity, at 02:00 hours from 8,500'. (one flash bomb was used). 6 B-26's were over the target and 3 B-26's dropped 22 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 02:14 hours from 9,000'. (one flash bomb was used). 8 x 500# Demolition bombs were salvaged safe just West of Lake Trasimeno on return because Flight Leader did not drop. 14 x 500# Demolition bombs were returned to base because Flight Leader, briefed to drop on lead a/c in formation, was unable to see bombs fall. 3 B-26's returned to base at 03:28 hours and 6 B-26's returned to base at 03:58 hours.

C. Results: Port Ercole: All bombs landed in the water.
Perugia: The bombs are believed to have landed among buildings on the East edge of town.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

Several lights of unidentified a/c were seen at distances over Italy, one or more dive-bombing Grosseto.

b. Situation: None.

2. Ground:

a. General:

Bombs were seen exploding at Grosseto enroute to target, indicating probable dive-bombing; three fires close together and in a straight line running North-South were seen on return from the target.

b. Communications:

Several headlights of motor vehicles moving North were seen 10 miles East of Grosseto at 01:55 hours.

c. Flak: Several nearly spent inaccurate tracers (probable 40 mm. fire) were fired from the vicinity of Grosseto.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather: Clear in all areas; ground haze over Italy.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From 2,000' at base to landfall at Castiglione d' Pescaia; to Castiglione d' Lago at 10,000'; to target at 90°T at 9,000'; breakaway left to Grosseto; to base.

F. Comments: None.
