Intelligence Narrative No. 246, Day Operation, 19 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Saylor.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 09:15 hours, 20 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Road Bridge 1½ miles South of Sienna, Italy. 2 A/C returned early due to engine trouble and spares replaced them. 18 A/C were over the target and 18 A/C dropped 144 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target from 9,600' to 9,000' at 11:05 hours on an Axis of 350°T. 8 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) were salvaged, of which the reason was that emergency necessitated it. No bombs were returned to base. 18 A/C returned safely to this base at 12:38 hours.

C. Results: There was an excellent concentration of bombs across the target with several possible direct hits.
