Intelligence Report No. 266. Day Operation, 2 July 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Deatly.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 08:25 hours, 30 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Duro Val Di Taro (M/R: P-649536, sheet 84), Italy. 4 B-26's returned early; 1 spare; 1 runaway propeller; 1 engine cutting out; 1 landing gear failed to retract. The a/c with engine cutting out is entitled to a sortie. 26 B-26's were over the target and dropped 164 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target, on three runs, at 10:54 hours, 11:00 hours, and 11:26 hours from 9,000' to 8,000' on axes of 90°T, 105°T, and 235°T. (8 A/C bombed on the 1st run, 9 A/C bombed on the 2nd run, and 9 A/C bombed on third run). 23 B-26's returned to base at 12:45 hours. 3 A/C landed at Corsica for gas.

C. Results: First Squadron hit on West end, second Squadron hit in the center, and the third Squadron hit on the East approach in excellent patterns, scoring eight direct hits.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- Air Activity: Spitfires from Corsica provided escort.
- Situation: None.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- Moneglia Railroad Bridges damaged.
- Bridge at P-4224 is up.
- Bridge damaged at P-1342.
- Railroad line cut at P-1044.

b. Communications:

- 40 Railroad cars at Pontremoli.
- 20 Railroad cars at Val Di Taro.
- 5/7 M/T moving North at Pontremoli at 10:50 hours.

c. Roads: None.

d. Shipping:

- 2 large, 6 small barges at San Margherita by 10:45 hours.
- 2 barges at Sestri Levante at 10:45 hours.
- 6 barges just South of Recco at 10:45 hours.
- 1 cruiser at La Spezia at 11:26 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather:

a. ~~Arrivals~~: CAVU to Corciano; haze; visibility 8-10 miles over water.

b. ~~Arrivals~~: 4-6/10ths lowering cumulus, base 5,000'; tops 10-11,000'; target open.

c. ~~Deviations~~: As enroute.

5. Routes and Altitudes: Base to rendezvous at Alte; to coast at Rocco; to Massaglia; to target (2nd Squadron circled to left for second run; 3rd Squadron circled to the left, passed over target, circled to right for second run; 1st Squadron dropped on the first run); homeward left to coast at Massaglia; to base.

6. Comments: The additional runs made by this group over the target, were made because of the clouds around the target.
