Intelligence Narrative No. 267, Day Operation, 3 July 1944.

Flight Commander: Colonel Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (E).

B. At 0848 hours, 30 B-26's took off to bomb fuel storage tanks at Savona, Italy, (M/N, O-584384, sheet 92). 2 B-26's returned early: 1 spare, 1 radio failure. 28 B-26's were over the target, and 24 B-26's dropped 192 x 500 lb demolition bombs (1/1C, .01 second delay fuses). 3 B-26's dropped 59 x 100 lb incendiary bombs. 8 x 500 lb demolitions were salvaged in the target area due to bombardier error; 1 x 100 lb incendiary was salvaged in the water, having hung up over the target. 28 B-26's returned to base at 1352 hours.

C. RESULTS: There was excellent coverage of the target. High explosions were seen followed by black smoke rising to 10,000' and white smoke to 9,000'.

1. Air: a. Air Activity: Spitfires from Corsica provided escort.
b. Situation: None.

- b. Communications: 1. at Savona M/V, 50 MM cars.
2. at 5735, 25 MM cars.

d. Shipping: 4 medium U/V's and 4 small S/V's in Savona harbor at 1153 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 2 by flak.

4. Weather: Enroute: Generally CAVU.
Target: Open; 6-7,000 cumulus at 6,000' to 8,000'; visibility 10 miles in haze.
Return: as enroute.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: Base to rendezvous with escort at Alto; to IP over water at 44 degrees 08 min. N., 06 degrees 41 min. E. to target; breakaway right to coast, south of Vado Lig; to base.
