Intelligence Narrative No. 273, D/NY Operation, 10 July 1944

Flight Commander: Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 14:45 hours, 19 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Railroad Bridge, Marmarotto North (M/R: L-787350), Italy. 1 B-26 returned early because it was a spare. The lead a/c of the formation experienced bomb-sight failure over the target, and the first Squadron did not drop. It later bombed the alternate target, Zoagli Viaduct, Italy, with another a/c in the lead. 18 B-26's were over the target. 9 B-26's dropped 72 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 17:22 hours from 9,500' to 9,000' on an Axis of 103°. 8 B-26's dropped 61 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on Zoagli Viaduct, Italy, at 18:10 hours from 8,500' to 8,000' on an Axis of 30°. 11 x 500# Demolition Bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) were salvaged in the water, 3 having hung up over the target and 8 because a/c had propeller governor failure and turned back just before bombing secondary target. 7 B-26's returned to base at 19:38 hours; 11 B-26's returned to base late between 20:43 hours and 21:16 hours after landing in Corsica for fuel.

C. Railroads: The target was covered with an excellent pattern of bombs, scoring several direct hits.

Zoagli Viaduct: This also covered with an excellent pattern, scoring several direct hits.

5. Losses: None. Damaged: 1 due to flak.

6. Weather:

- a. Approach: Scattered cumulus at 5,000'.
- b. Target: Scattered clouds in area; target open but hazy.
- c. Return: As enroute.

Routings: Base to rendezvous at Alto; landfall at Tafano; to OP, Castel Miovo; to IP, Monferrato; to target; breakaway left to Monferrato; to Zoagli (second Squadron returned to base) direct run on coast 9 miles North of Zoagli; 180° curve to sea; bomb run on Zoagli from sea; breakaway right to base.
