Intelligence Narrative No. 278, Day Operation, 19 July 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Hunger.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 08:35 hours, 24 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Guastalla Road Bridge (M/R: L-346993, sheet 73), Italy. 2 B-26's returned early to base: 1 because crew-member ill; 1 because of high oil temperature. 22 B-26's were over the target and dropped 172 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 11:04 hours from 9,000' to 8,500' on axes of 63°T and 57°E. 4 x 500# Demolition bombs were returned to base, having hung up over the target. 21 B-26's returned to base at 13:15 hours, and 1 returned to base late at 15:30 hours after going into Corsica for gas.

C. Results: The bridge was hit by an excellent tight pattern of bombs which put the western half down in the water.

D. Observations:

- (2) 1 silver P-38 6,000' above the formation headed North over the target at 11:05 hours.

- (1) 1 a/c or dummy on L/G just West of Parma at 11:10 hours.
- (2) 5/6 a/c at Reggio Emilia A/D at 11:01 hours.

2. Ground:

- (1) Smoke screens at bridges at P-1805 and P-4511, at 11:04 hours.
- (2) Viadano road bridge 1/3 destroyed by another B-26 Group this date.
- (3) Radio tower at P-5115 reported yesterday not seen.
- (4) RR bridge at P-1805, 4 spans destroyed.
- (5) RR bridge at P-9176, 1 span destroyed, Southeast end.
- (6) RR Bridge at P-0289, 1 span destroyed, East end.
- (7) RR bridge at P-829673, destroyed.
- (8) Monaglia RR bridge P-4327, damaged and impassable.
- (9) Road bridges destroyed at P-6168 and P-7575.
- (10) 1 span of road bridge cut at P-4511.
- (11) RR bridge at P-6553 unserviceable but intact.
- (12) At N/Y at P-4505, storage dump of engineer supplies.

b. Communications:

- (1) Coastal line, all yards almost empty from P-2727 to P-6010.
- (2) 130 RR cars from P-6553 to L-0081.
- (3) 130 RR cars from P-9276 to P-9291.
- (4) 60 RR cars from P-8994 to L-0089.
- (5) 55 RR cars at Parma.
- (6) 215 RR cars from L-2090 to P-4595.
- (7) 40 RR cars at P-4900.
- (8) 30 RR cars at L-1599.
- (9) Small RR line Parma to P-0109 appears to be gone.

c. Flaks: None.

d. Shipping:

- (1) Only one barge off shore at P-1998, otherwise no change in coastal shipping at 10:46 hours.
- (2) 1 barge at P-4006 at 11:04 hours.
- (3) 5 barges at L-3498 at 11:04 hours.
- (4) 11 barges at L-2897 at 11:04 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather:

- a. Enroute: Scattered cumulus at Italian coast.
- b. Targets: CAVU.
- c. Returns: As enroute.

E. Routings: Base to rendezvous at Gorgono Island; to Moniglia; to Borgo Val Di Torro; to Parma; to target; breakaway left to Pidenza; to Rezzoagli; to Sestri Levanti; to base.
