Intelligence Narrative No. 272, Day Operation, 14 July 1944.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 08:15 hours, 24 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Piacenza Railroad Bridge (M/R: E-623169, sheet 60), Italy. 2 B-26's returned early because they were sparce. The formation was unable to reach the target due to towering cumulus clouds, and turned back over Pognovo at 10:48 hours at 14,700' to 14,200'. 1 B-26 salvoed 4 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses), because being low on fuel, over water. 22 B-26's returned to base at 12:25 hours.

(1) Spitfires from Corsica provided escort.
(2) 6 S/E unidentified S/E A/C were seen in a distance over Fornovo at 10:49 hours, as escort was heard to call out, "Enemy fighters in vicinity".
