Intelligence Narrative No. 260, Day operation, 15 July 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Berge.

Ae 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 05:55 hours, 24 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Railroad Bridge 2 miles North-East of Rovazza (O/R: P-258208, sheet 62), Italy. 2 B-26's returned early: 1 spare; 1 excessive fuel pressure. 22 B-26's were over the target and dropped 86 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 08:17 hours from 9,000' to 8,000' on an axis of 341°. 2 x 1,000# Demolition bombs were returned to base, having hung up over the target. 22 B-26's returned to base at 10:12 hours.

C. Results: The bridge was completely covered with an excellent concentration of bombs, scoring several direct hits and many damaging near misses.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

- (1) P-47's provided escort; spitfires patrolled in the area.
- (2) 2 unidentified A/C seen between the target and coast to the rear of the formation, flying North, at 08:29 hours.

b. Situation:

- (1) 4 a/c (2 S/E, 2 V/R a/c) on Reggio Emilia A/D at 08:06 hours.
- (2) At Collecchio A/D 3 S/E a/c turning to taxi onto runway at 08:26 hours.
- (3) Barge Val di Tegro A/D appeared unserviceable.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) Active factory 2 miles North-East of Ostia at 08:10 hours.
- (2) Bridge at Monaglia still out.
- (3) Railroad Bridge West of Roceto out.
- (4) Casalmaggiore Railroad Bridge still out.
- (5) 2/3 spans out of Larun Bridge out.
- (6) German broadcasting on Command frequency (6446) while over enemy territory at 08:00 hours.

b. Communications:

- (1) One 30 car train with locomotive, stationary, and 100 RR cars in M/Y at Parma at 08:26 hours.
- (2) At Marcaria, train of 20 M/Y cars, stationary, locomotive on East end at 08:17 hours.
- (3) Train of 25/30 cars stationary, locomotive on North-East end, halfway between target and Rovazza at 08:17 hours.

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- (4) 1 locomotive and 35 cars headed South-east, 2 miles South-East of Fidenza at 06:25 hours.
 (5) 20/25 RR cars at Bremola.
 (6) 15/20 RR cars at Fidenza.
 (7) 5 strings of 15/20 RR cars between Parma and Reggio Emilia.
 (8) 25 RR cars at junction North of Medesano.
 (9) 20 RR cars at station 1 mile West of Noce.
 (10) 50 RR cars at Novallara.
 (11) 20 M/T cars changed, stationary, North-West of Marbolo at 06:22 hours.

(12) Traffic moving both directions between Suzzara and Viadana at 06:20 hours.
