Intelligence Narrative No. 292, Day Operation, 16 July 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Col. Macia.

A. 320th Bombardment group (M).

B. At 16:20 hours, 24 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Brussona Road and Railroad Bridge (N/R: D-1622A5, sheet 59), Italy. 2 B-26's returned early because they were spares. 22 B-26's were over the target and dropped 88 x 1,000-lb Demolition Bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 18:33 hours from 9,000' to 8,500' on an axis of 100° T. 22 B-26's returned to base at 21:59 hours.

C. Results: An excellent pattern of bombs covered the target, scoring several direct hits. Visual observations after bombing confirmed the destruction of at least two spans.

D. Observations:

- (1) Spitfires and P-47's provided escort.
- (2) 1 silver B-26 at 500 feet altitude headed South-South-East at landfall with 2 Spitfires escorting at 19:16 hours.
- (3) 15/20 s/n unidentified a/c flying formation at 2,000' yards behind the formation at 8,000', south of Alessandria at 18:32 hours.

Alessandria A/D empty and field camouflaged with row of trees down the center at 18:32 hours.

(12) 12 RR cars in first M/Y East of Pavia.

(13) 15 RR cars in first M/Y North of Pavia.

(14) 75/100 RR cars at Voghera.

(15) 2 M/T moving West just out of Acqui at 18:30 hours.

(16) 25/30 M/T moving North at Chassine at 18:31 hours.

(17) 12 M/T moving North 12 miles South of Alessandria at 18:32 hours.

(18) 25/30 RR cars and 15 M/T moving North at Pruggarrie (South-East of Alessandria) at 18:32 hours.
