Intelligence Narrative No. 201. Day Operation, 17 July 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Robbins.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 06:29 hours, 24 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Asti Road and Railroad Bridge. (M/R: J-435049, sheet 69). Italy. 2 B-26's returned early because the were spares. 22 B-26's were over the target and dropped 86 x 1,000# demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) were dropped on the target at 10:47 hours from 9,000' to 8,500' on an Axis of 263° T. 22 B-26's returned to base at 12:59 hours.

C. Results: An excellent concentration of bombs covered the entire bridge and approached, scoring several direct hits. The bridge is believed destroyed.

e. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

f. Weather:

- a. Barometric: Few scattered cumulus at coast of Italy, tops 7,000'.
- b. Visibility: Clear, visibility 12 miles in haze; towering cumulus over mountains inland.
- c. Surface: As enroute.

g. Routes and Altitudes: Base to rendezvous at I'le Rousse; to landfall at Varazze; to Novi Ligure; curve North of Oviglia; to target; breakaway left to Alba; 360° circle over Alba on photo reconnaissance; to Varazze; to base.

h. Comments: None.
