Intelligence Narrative No. 208, Day operation, 24 July 1944

Flight Commander: Captain Probasso.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 07:35 hours, 24 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Railroad Viaduct South-East of Ovada (M/R: 0-766732, sheet 82), Italy. 3 B-26's returned early; 2 spares, 1 engine cutting out. 21 B-26's were over the target and 21 dropped 89 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 a .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 10:07 hours from 9,400' to 8,900' on an Axis of 23° T. 1 x 1,000# Demolition bomb (1/10 a .01 second delay fuses) was salvaged in the water having hung up over the target. 18 B-26's returned to base at 12:02 hours; 3 B-26's returned late after landing in Corsica for gas.

C. Results: All bombs landed in the target area in an excellent pattern, scoring several direct hits and many near misses.

D. Observations:

1. AIR:

a. AIR ACTIVITY: Spitfires and P-47's from Corsica provided escort.
b. SITUATION: Novi Ligure A/D empty at 09:50 hours.

g. Route: Base to rendezvous at Ille Rousse; to landfall at Savona; to Ovada; to Predean; to Tortona; to Pontecurone; right turn to Sorrevalle; bomb run on target; breakaway right; curve left to Albisola Marina; to base.
