Intelligence Narrative No. 312. Day Operation, 16 August 1944.

Flight Commander: Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 15:19 hours, 36 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Gun Position at St. Mandrier (M/R: (B) Y-937925, sheet), France. 2 B-26's returned early: spares; one additional spare sighted possible yellow life-rafts in the water at $42^{\circ} 03' \text{ North}$ / $06^{\circ} 00' \text{ East}$, at 16:15 hours, and called sector-control, circled until 18:40 hours, saw launch approaching, returned to base late at 19:35 hours. 22 B-26's were over the target. 22 B-26's dropped 44 x 2,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 17:04 hours from 12,500' to 12,000' on an Axis of 310°T . 4 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) were salvoed by lead a/c of third squadron, because of engine trouble. This a/c was unable to gain bombing altitude and led squadron from formation just before bombing. 40 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) were returned to base by this formation. 33 B-26's returned to base at 18:35 hours.

C. Results: A good bomb pattern covered the target area, and the target is believed to be hit. The bombs of the squadron landed South of the target area.

Heavy flak commenced just as formation leveled off for bomb run, and continued on breakaway. No flak was encountered until lead squadron completed glide just before bomb run. Both 105 mm. and 88 mm. bursts were reported.

d. Shipping:

- (1) 3 cruisers or destroyers at R/16.
- (2) Several small boats in naval base.
- (3) 1 large M/V and 10/15 small craft at L/13.
- (4) 1 large M/V and 4 small craft at P/9.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 8.

4. Weather:

- a. Enroute: Scattered strato-cumulus at 4,000'.
- b. Target: Open; low broken strato-cumulus in area.
- c. Returns: As enroute.

E. Routes: Base to Port Gros Island; to I.P., 2 miles south of Porquerolles Island; to target at 310 T; breakaway left; to base.
