Intelligence Narrative No. 214, Day Operation, 18 August 1944.

Flight Commander, Captain Munnallee.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 09:03 hours, 32 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb CD Gun Position (M/R: (B) Y-934925, GSGS 4249, sheet 15R), France. 2 B-26's returned early. Spares. This formation included 12 B-26's flying as flak decoys for this and another formation of this Group bombing another target. 30 B-26's were over the target. 17 B-26's dropped 34 x 2,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 10:56 hours from 10,800' to 11,800' on Axes of 315°T and 325°T. 2 x 2,000# Demolition bombs were salvoed near target area (one or both possibly in water) by a/c having engine trouble. 30 B-26's returned to base at 12:20 hours.

C. Results: An excellent pattern of bombs covered the target and at least two direct hits are believed to have been scored.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

- (1) P-47's, P-38's, and Hellcats provided area cover.
- (2) P-47's bombing, started fire, at K/S (TC 6-101A-NA).

b. Situation: None.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) Large fire on docks at Toulon at 10:56 hours.

(2) No smoke screen in operation at target, but some smoke pots were operating at Toulon dock at 10:56 hours.

- (3) Lighthouse or flak tower flashing at R/3 (TC 6-101A-NA) at 10:56 hours.

b. Communications: None.

c. Flak: Decoy a/c simulated bomb run 3 minutes ahead of the formation, dropping from 12,000' to 9,000' and broke from the target three seconds past the bomb release line. The lead decoy flight reported S. H. F-A flak commencing at the instant of breakaway and following for a few seconds on the breakaway. The a/c in this flight commenced dropping chaff 12 miles short of the target and continued for 15 seconds (see special chaff report for further details).

The second decoy flight made a similar run, but pulled to the right to draw fire away from the striking forces. It reported M. H. A. I flak, part of which burst directly over the target and part much closer to this flight. These a/c dropped chaff at intervals commencing 3 minutes before the target, and continuing 3 minutes after.

Positions: 4 H at E/3, 4 H at E/5, 2 H at S/9, 2 H at E/19, and from 2 flak boats at G/9.

Flak was accurate for only the first Squadron in which 7 out of 9 a/c received holes. Flak began just as lead Squadron broke, and followed for a few seconds on the breakaway.

d. Shipping:

- (1) 10/12 Medium M/V's at E/6 (TG 6-101A-NA) at 10:56 hours.
- (2) 2 Cruisers and 1 destroyer at E/12 at 10:56 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 7 by flak.

4. Weather:

- a. Enroute: Clear with haze.
- b. Target: Clear but visibility 8 miles in haze.
- c. Return: As enroute.

E. Routes: Base to I.P., $42^{\circ} 50' \text{ North}$ / $06^{\circ} 10' \text{ East}$; to target; breakaway left; to base.

F. Comments: Squadrons used slightly different axes of attack.
