Intelligence Narrative No. 317, Day Operation, 20 August 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Deatly.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 12:12 hours, 7 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb C.D. Gun position at Toulon, J-46 (M/R: (B) Y-926936, GSGS 4249, Sheet 15R), France. 1 B-26 returned early: No harness for parachute. 6 B-26's were over the target. 5 B-26's dropped 10 x 2,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 13:49 hours from 11,400' to 10,900' on an Axis of 335°T. 2 x 2,000# Demolition bombs were salvoed, 1 over land and 1 over water. These bombs hung up over the target, and only 1 dropped on the first attempt to salvo. 6 B-26's returned to base at 15:19 hours.

C. Results: A good pattern of bombs landed on the left edge of the target area, scoring near misses on the gun position and exploding 2 oil storage tanks.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- Air Activity: P-38's and P-47's were seen in the target area.
- Situation: None.

2. Ground:

a. General:

(1) Oil slick, being circled by destroyers, 5 miles south-east of Toulon, at 13:41 hours.

b. Communications: None.

c. Flak: At Target: M, H, A, A, barrage followed by CP on the Breakaway. Began 2 minutes before bombs away and continued on the breakaway for 2 minutes after bombs away. Both 88 mm. and 105 mm. reported.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 4 due to flak. 6 men injured.

4. Weather:

- Enroute: CAVU.
- Target: CAVU.
- Return: CAVU.

E. Routes: Base to I.P., 42° 50' North/ 06° 00' East; to target, breakaway right; to base.

F. Comments: None.
