HEADQUARTERS 320TH BOMBARDMENT GROUP (M) Office of the Group Intelligence Officer APO 650

Intelligence Marrative No. 322, Day Operation, 22 August 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Smith.

- A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 08:25 hours, 20 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Road Bridge at Vergato (M/R: (W) 1-696265. GSGS 4164. sheet 98). Italy. 2 B-26's returned early: Spares. 18 B-26's were over the target and 18 B-26's dropped 72 x 1,000% Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 10.43 hours from 10,600' to 10,100' on an Axis of 115°T. 17 B-26's returned to base at 12:54 hours. 1 8-26 was lost, due to flak. The A/C was hit in the right engine over the target; fell behind the formation with 2 B-26's escorting over Collagna; feathered propeller 5/10 miles west of Ia Spezia; flew to Corsica; ditched 50 yards off-shore, near a, as yet, unknown town. 7 men in crew were reported rescusd after 20 minutes in life-raft by a launch.
- G. Results: Most of the bombs landed over to the Bast, covering the Railroad Bridge with a good pattern. A few bombs possibly hit the target bridge.

D. Observations.

(1) P-47's and Spitfires provided area escort.

(2) 1 unidentified s/E s/c flying West below the formation, 8 miles West of Vergato at 10:40 hours.

(3) 1 Me-109, 15 miles East of Seatri Levante, headed East at 4,000. 10:18 hours, dark brown color on top.

b. Situation: Pavullo empty, field uncerviceable.

2. Ground:

a. General.

- (1) Huge column of black smoke from Villafranco at 10:21 hours.
- (2) Active factory 2 miles South of Villafranco at 10:21 hours.
- (3) Smoke sereen over bridge at Aulla at.10:21 hours.

(4) Hospital at Panteremoli.

(5) Bridges at L-3141 and L-3037 out. No bomb crators in wisinity.

b. Communications:

- (1) Probable train headed Hast. 3 miles Hast of Aulla at 10:21 hours.
- (2) 4/5 car train headed North, stationary, locomotive with steam up, 3 miles South of Villafranco at 10:21 hours.

(3) 12/14 RR cars at Moneglia.

(4) 12 RR cars at first MY mast of Aulla.

(5) 6 M/T headed mast 5 miles mast of Sestri Levante at 10:15 hours.

Commenced 10 seconds before bombs away and continued for 10 seconds after breakaway. 1 large red burst was seen high and to the North of the formation, encountered by a/c, which was damaged, and escort.

- d. Shipping:
 - (1) 2 coasters at Marina Di Carrera at 11:09 hours.
 - (2) 1 cruiser, 2 medium M/V's at la Spesia at 11:07 hours.
 - (3) I medium M/V at Sestri Levante at 10:14 hours.
 - (4) Submarine net at La Spezia.
- 3. Losses: 1 due to flak. Damaged: 5 due to flak.
- 4. Weather:
 - a. Enroute: Scattered cumulus at 4,0004.
 - b. Target: Clear but hazy.
 - c. Return: As enroute.
- E. Routes: Base to rendervous at Gorgona Island; to landfall at Sestri Levante; to Pohteremoli; to IP. Pavullo Nel Frignano; bomb run on target; breakaway sharp right; to Monese; to Pavullo Nel Frignano; to Sestri Levante; to base. (Damaged a/c. later ditched, and 2 escert lost formation at Collagna, left coast 8 miles North of La Spezia).
- F. Comments: On Commend Frequency, the following was heard, as the formation approached Corsica on return: "TOPNOTCH 63 calling TOPNOTCH 56. Give me a long call on No. 3 transmitter". Voice was American. Pilot of 56 did not answer because Topnotch 63 was not in the formation and No. 3 transmitters have been removed from all a/s. Also heard about the same time, was counting from 1 to 10 in German, on Channel "A".

Additional Comments: On the second mission of 21 August, 1944, reported in Intelligence Harrative No. 321, the following corrections should be made:

48 x 500# Demolition bombs were returned to base.

80 x 500g Demolition bombs were salvoed over enemy territory: 8 by aircraft which was lost, 32 by aircraft either damaged by flak or having engine trouble, which landed at Grosstto AD before returning to base.

8 x 500# Demolition bombs were salvoed off Sardinia by aircraft damaged by flak which Bad difficulty lowering wheels.
