Intelligence Narrative No. 327, Day Operation, 27 August 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Rowan.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 08,50 Hours, 30 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Medium CD Guns on the Ile Patenneau (M/R; (B) T-404133, CGCS 4249, Sheet 15R), France. 3 B-26's returned Early; 2 spares; 1 engine sputtering out. 27 B-26's were over the target and 27 B-26's dropped 108 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 10:44 hours from 9,120' to 8,600' on an Axis of 05° T. 27 B-26's returned to base at 12:22 hours.

C. Results: An excellent bomb pattern covered the target area, and several direct hits were probably scored. A tremendous explosion, with many red and green flashes, was seen among the bomb bursts.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: P-47's were seen in the target area.
- b. Situation: None.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) Smoke bomb, smoking on the water, at 41° 30' North/ 06° 55' East; small boat ½ mile to East, at 11:08 hours.
- (2) Oil slick at 42° 50' North/ 05° 20' East, and a 5,000-ton M/V next to it at 10:39 hours.
- (3) Many fires along coast near Marseilles; Destroyers seen shelling at 10:44 hours.
- (4) Target guns seen firing at ships, stopped suddenly as bombers approached.

b. Communications: None.

c. Flak:

Cap Mejean : slight, Light, Inaccurate, Inaccurate flak.  
Marseille : slight, Light, Inaccurate, Inaccurate, 20 bursts - reported by one crew only.

d. Shipping: See General.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather:

- a. Enroute: Clear with haze.
- b. Target: Clear with haze.
- c. Return: As enroute.

E. Routes: Base to I.P.,  $43^{\circ} 00'$  North/  $05^{\circ} 16'$  East; to target; breakaway left; to base.
