Intelligence Narrative No. 329, Day Operation, 29 August 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Nashville.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0745 30 B-26's took off to bomb S. Dona Piave RR Bridge (M/R: (R) G 865725, 0900S 4164, sheet 52.). 2 B-26's returned early, spares. 27 B-26's were over the target and dropped 108 x 1000 pound demolition bombs (1/10, 01 second delay fuses) on the target at 1045 hours from 9000 feet to 8500 feet on an Axis of 238 degrees. 27 B-26's landed at Cecina at 1221 hours. 26 B-26's returned to base between 1645 hours and 1724 hours. 1 B-26 took off from Cecina but turned back to return to Cecina due to engine trouble. 1 B-26 was lost; crashed on takeoff due to loss of power; A/C destroyed; crew safe.

C. Results: An excellent pattern of bombs covered the target, scoring several direct hits. Visual observation after bombing confirmed that the NW half of the bridge is collapsed in the water.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

- (1). B-24's and B-25's were seen bombing in the area.
- (2). Escort failed to rendezvous but 21 S/Z friendly A/C were seen 35 miles S. of the target at 1032 hours.
- (3). 1 crew member reported an ME-110 flying S. at 6000 feet, 25 miles S. of the target, at 1036 hours.

b. Situation: None

2. Ground:

- a. General: Possible net across inlet mouth at Cesole.
- b. Communications:

- (1). 8 RR cars in M/Y at S. Dona Piave.
- (2). 90 M/T headed N. from Lasolo at 1043 hours.
- (3). Train of 30 cars stationary, locomotive facing N. at Triviso at 1042 hours.
- (4). 60 M/T in groups of 10 headed E. out of Biagis D' Gallalda at 1043 hours.

c. Flak: None.

- d. Shipping: 15/20 barges, 2 moving E. in Canal SW. of Lesolo at 1042 hours.

- (2). 7 barges just N. of target at 1046 hours
(3). 8 small craft moving NE. in sea S. of target at
1041 hours.
(4). 2 M/V at Birano at 1041 hours.

E. Losses: 1 crashed on take off. Damaged: None.

F. Weather:

- a. Enroute: Very scattered cumulus at 2000 feet.
b. Target: Clear with haze.
c. Return: As enroute.

G. Routes: Base to rendezvous point at Loreto (escort failed to rendezvous) over water to 10 miles S. of target; 360 degrees curve to right; to target; breakaway left; curve right over target; to Maccone; to Lake Trasimeno to Cecina.
