Intelligence Narrative No. 331, Day Operation, 2 September 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Rummallee.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 15:30 hours, 19 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Ronco Scrivia Railroad Bridge (M/R: (V) C-996716, GSGS 4164, Sheet 82), Italy. 2 B-26's returned to base early: 1 engine cutting out; 1 blown gasket. 17 B-26's were over the target, on three runs, but no bombs were dropped, because the target could not be identified, due to heavy ground haze and late afternoon shadows. The formation was over the target at 17:31 hours, 17:45 hours, and 18:20 hours from 9,000' to 8,500' on axes of 300°, 110°, and 300°. 8 x 1,000# Demolition bombs were salvaged: 4 because the tail fin came loose and fuse came out of one bomb, and was salvaged over water; 4 because the pilot did not want to make a night landing with a bomb load. 60 x 1,000# Demolition bombs were returned to base. 14 B-26's returned to base at 20:19 hours. 3 B-26's landed at 22:00 hours, after landing in Ghisonaccia, Corsica, for fuel.

C. Results: None.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: Spitfires and P-47's were seen in the target area.
- b. Situation: None.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) Large fire with gray smoke in La Spezia.
- (2) 4 railroad bridges South of Novi Ligure rebuilt and passable.

b. Communications:

- (1) 40 RR cars at Ovada.
- (2) 50 RR cars at Novi Ligure.

c. Flak:

La Spezia: S-M, H, A, A, CP fire 4H at P-6114.
3H at P-8503.
3H at P-7002.

La Spezia: S, L, I, I.

Sestri Levante: S, L, I, I.

d. Shipping:

- (1) 3 medium M/V's, 5 small craft in drydock, at Sestri Levante at 17:58 hours.
- (2) 1 large and 2 medium M/V's at La Spezia at 18:46 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 1 due to flak; 1 crew member injured by flak.

4. Weather:

- a. Barometer: 3/10ths Cumulus at 5,000'.

- b. Target: 7/10ths Casalus at 8,000'; visibility very poor due to haze.
c. Return: as enroute.

E. Route: Base to landfall, at Moneglia; to Borgonasco; to Torrigin; to target; curve right, South of Alessandria; to Ovada; to target; to Chiavari; curve right, then left; to Moneglia; to Torrigin; to target; curve right, to 5 miles East of Borgonasco; to East of La Spezia; to Marina Di Massa; to Base.
