Intelligence Narrative No. 335. Day Operation, 5 September 1944.

Flight Commander: Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 07:55 hours, 30 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Road Bridge South-East of Pavia (M/R: (a) K-250280, CSOS 4164, Sheet 59). Italy. No B-26's returned early. 29 B-26's were over the target and dropped 116 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 10:39 hours from 9,300' to 8,100' on an Axis of 280°T. 21 B-26's returned to base at 12:50 hours. 1 B-26 landed at Elmas with a injured crew member and returned to base at 13:45 hours. 3 B-26's returned to base by 14:56 hours, after landing in Corsica for fuel. 4 B-26's are believed to be in Corsica for fuel. 1 B-26, A/C Battle No. 68, lost, was hit by flak over Ferrebetti; the left propeller was feathered. A/C dropped out of the formation and headed North, losing altitude but apparently under control. 4 parachutes were seen to emerge, and A/C went into clouds and was lost from view at 45° 15' North/ 08° 52' East.

C. Results: Excellent concentration of bombs landed in the target area, scoring several direct hits.

D. Observations:

- a. Air Activity: B-25's were seen headed South from Pavia.  
B-47's were seen in the target area.  
b. Situation: 3 Silver S/E A/C at Piacenza South.

c. Flak:

North of Torreberetti: H - H - A - A - GP 4 H at J-7721.

North of Piacenza : S & H - A - I - GP 8 H at K-6117.

Stradella : S - H - I - I - GP

Bursts of 4 tracked for 4½ minutes from J-8915 to J-8340.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: 1 due to flak. Damaged: 10 due to flak.

4. Weather:

a. Roxana: Generally CAVU; occasional small patches of low thin Stratus over water.

b. Vicinity of Tanguit: Large broken patches of thin Stratus, tops estimated 6 - 7,000', increasing to the West, decreasing to the East.

c. Tanguit:

(a) Parma area, large patch of thin Stratus West of the target, breaking at target, target open for bombing on attack from the East.

(b) Area West of Milan, patch of Stratus South of target covered the I.P. and part of the bomb run, but target was open; visibility unlimited in all areas.

d. Return: Same as enroute.

E. Route: From base to Moniglia; to Tortona; to Mortara; to South of Pavia; curve left West of Piacenza; to target; breakaway left to Moniglia; to base.

F. Comments: Additional information on B-26, Battle No. 68, that went down.

One crew, which returned later after landing at a B-25 field, reported that B-25 crews saw a B-26 of our formation hit the ground and explode near Mortara. This report was confirmed by a teletype from 4-3, 57th Bomb. Wing, which stated: B-26 aircraft was last seen at J-8035 with one chute landing at J-7843.

d. Shelling: None.

3. Losses: 1 due to flak. Damaged: 10 due to flak.

4. Weather:

a. Lucca: Generally CAVU; occasional small patches of low thin stratus over water.

b. Vicinity of Tangent: Large broken patches of thin stratus, tops estimated 6 - 7,000', increasing to the West, decreasing to the East.

c. Turin:

(a) Parma area, large patch of thin stratus West of the target, breaking at target, target open for bombing on attack from the East.

(b) Area West of Milan, patch of stratus South of target covered the I.P. and part of the bomb run, but target was open; visibility unlimited in all areas.

d. Return: Same as enroute.

E. Routem: From base to Monoglia; to Tortona; to Mortara; to South of Pavia; curve left West of Piacenza; to target; breakaway left to Monoglia; to base.
